The Watauga County Board of Commissioners held a regular meeting, as scheduled, on Tuesday, April 18, 2017, at 5:30 P.M. in the Commissioners' Board Room of the Watauga County Administration Building, Boone, North Carolina.

Chairman Welch called the meeting to order at 5:30 P.M.

Commissioner Yates opened with prayer and Vice-Chairman Kennedy led the Pledge of Allegiance.

PROPOSED PROCLAMATION HONORING DR. JACK D. LAWRENCE, SR.

Chairman Welch read a proposed proclamation honoring the life of Dr. Jack D. Lawrence, Sr. for his lifelong public service to Watauga County.

Commissioner Yates, seconded by Commissioner Turnbow, moved to adopt the proclamation as presented.

PUBLIC HEARING TO ALLOW CITIZEN COMMENT REGARDING A FOSCOE/GRANDFATHER COMMUNITY ZONING MAP AMENDMENT

A public hearing was scheduled for the Foscoe-Grandfather Community Zoning Map Amendment requested by FS Holdings Ltd., owners of a 2.44 acre tract located at 178/190 Riley Road in Foscoe.

Mr. John Spears, Planner I, presented the request to rezone from Highway Commercial to Light Industrial. Mr. Spears stated that, if the Board of Commissioners approves the map amendment, then the Board of Adjustment would consider a conditional use permit for the rezoned property.

Commissioner Yates, seconded by Vice-Chairman Kennedy, moved to call the public hearing to order at 5:46 P.M.

PLANNING & INSPECTIONS MATTERS

A. Transfer of Easements from Middle Fork Greenway/Watauga County Pathways

Mr. Joe Furman, Planning and Inspections Director, requested the Board approve and accept the assignment of easements for four (4) tracts of land related to the Middle Fork Greenway located between Tweetsie Railroad and Niley Cook Road.

Vice-Chairman Kennedy, seconded by Commissioner Turnbow, moved to accept the assignment of the easements as presented.

B. Proposed North Carolina Parks and Recreation Trust Fund (PARTF) Application Certification

Mr. Joe Furman presented a North Carolina Parks and Recreation Trust Fund (PARTF) application certification which requires Board approval and is part of the application for the Middle Fork Greenway project.

Commissioner Turnbow, seconded by Vice-Chairman Kennedy, moved to approve the certification as presented.

C. Proposed Amendments to the Ordinance to Govern Subdivisions and Multi-Unit Structures

Mr. Ric Mattar, Planning Board Chairman, presented the Planning Board's recommended amendments to the Ordinance To Govern Subdivisions and Multi-Unit Structures as a result of the Board of Commissioners' January request to review the ordinance. A public hearing was requested to be scheduled for May 16, 2017, at 5:30 PM.

Commissioner Yates, seconded by Commissioner Hodges, moved to schedule a public hearing for May 16, 2017, at 5:30 PM to allow citizen comment on the proposed amendments to the Ordinance to Govern Subdivisions and Multi-Unit Structures.

MAINTENANCE MATTERS

A. Architect Selection for Health Department Renovations

Per discussion at the annual retreat, staff has proceeded forward with the planning of the relocation of the Planning and Inspections, Veterans Services, and Red Cross offices to the Watauga County Health Department. The relocation will assist in the establishment of a one-stop process with regards to individuals needing a building and septic permit. Also, veterans will

be closer to other services offered by the County with their new location in the Health Department.

North Carolina General Statute 143-64.31 requires the hiring of architectural, engineering, surveying, construction management at risk services, design-build services, and public-private partnership construction services to be selected on the basis of demonstrated competence and qualification for the type of professional services required without regard to fee. However, NCGS 143-64.32 allows for an exemption on the above requirement in writing when an estimated professional fee is in an amount less than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000).

Mr. Robert Marsh, Maintenance Director, stated that, in order to move the project forward, staff recommends the Board hire David R. Jones Architecture to design the proposed renovation project. Mr. Jones' estimate for the renovation is \$129,071.58 with his fee set at \$12,907.16 for a total project cost of \$141,978.74. Staff has identified \$12,907.16 in the current budget with the \$129,071.58 project cost to be incorporated into the Fiscal Year 2017-2018 budget. County Manager Geouque stated that staff preferred Scheme II.

Commissioner Yates, seconded by Commissioner Turnbow, moved to exempt the Health Department building renovations project per NCGS 143-64.32 and hire David R. Jones Architecture, contingent upon a contract being reviewed by the County Attorney.

B. HVAC Bid Award Request for Winkler's Creek Facility – New License Plate and Maintenance Offices

Mr. Marsh stated that the County recently received the following four (4) bids for the replacement of the HVAC equipment and duct work at the Winkler's Creek Facility (the former AppalCART building):

Mr. Marsh recommended acceptance of HVAC Inc.'s bid, the lowest responsive bidder, in the amount of \$23,801 for the replacement of the HVAC system. Adequate funds have been budgeted to cover this expense.

Vice-Chairman Kennedy, seconded by Commissioner Turnbow, moved to award the bid for the replacement of the HVAC system at the Winkler's Creek Facility to HVAC Inc. in the amount of \$23.801.

C. Change Order Request for LEC Water and Sewer Project

Mr. Marsh stated that the Board awarded a contract to Iron Mountain Construction in October 2016 to upgrade the sewer lift station at the Watauga County Law Enforcement Center (LEC). Subsequent to this, the County solicited bids for upgrading a portion of the existing water service at the Law Enforcement Center. Iron Mountain was the lowest responsive bidder for this project as well. In an effort to expedite the water project and realize a cost savings; staff is requesting the Board authorize a change order to Iron Mountain's current contract in the amount of \$51,724. Funds from the administrative contingency have been identified to cover the expense.

Commissioner Yates, seconded by Commissioner Turnbow, moved to approve Iron Mountain Construction's change order in the amount \$51,724 for upgrade/replacement of a portion of the existing water line at the Law Enforcement Center.

FINANCE MATTERS

A. Proposed Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) Budget Amendment

Ms. Margaret Pierce, Finance Director, presented a revised Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) FY 2016-17 Funding Allocation form. One of the original programs was unable to fully

expend funds and, therefore, the Council has requested to transfer \$1,288 to the Administrative line to be used for the upcoming State of the Child event and other miscellaneous expenses. No additional County funding is required.

Commissioner Yates, seconded by Vice-Chairman Kennedy, moved to approve the revised Juvenile Crime Prevention Council funding allocation as presented by Ms. Pierce.

B. Budget Amendment

Ms. Pierce stated that over the last two (2) years, staff has incrementally increased the funds budgeted to be received from the State for the Medicaid Hold Harmless. Sales tax collection and Medicaid expenses affect the amount received by the County. Staff is conservative in the amounts budgeted for these funds due to the uncertainty in sales tax collection and Medicaid expenses and the State's history of withholding or reducing funds designated for Counties. A perfect example is Lottery funds in which the State has not upheld their statutory commitment.

The additional \$400,000, if recognized, will be utilized for the County to continue the catch-up process on capital needs that have not been met over the last several years due to the economic downturn. A formal budget amendment will be presented at a future meeting detailing a list of capital projects and items.

Vice-Chairman Kennedy, seconded by Commissioner Yates, moved to recognize \$400,000 in additional revenue from Medicaid Hold Harmless.

PROPOSED APPLICATION FOR DIVISION OF WATER RESOURCES GRANT FOR MIDDLE FORK GREENWAY

MANAGER'S COMMENTS:

Mr. Furman, Planning and Inspections Director, will request permission from the Commissioners to apply for up to \$200,000 from the NC Division of Water Resources (DWR) for the Middle Fork Greenway, Section 4. This is the section for which PARTF funds are being requested. The match for the DWR grant would be provided through grants and other funds the Middle Fork Greenway Association has on hand. No County funds are requested. The application is due July 1st. The grant guidelines are available at https://ncdenr.s3.amazonaws.com/s3fs-public/Water%20Resources/documents/DRAFT%20Spring%202017%20WRDPG%20Guidelines%20v8.pdf. Attached is the required resolution, which was drafted from the model, included in the guidelines.

Board action is required to authorize staff to apply for \$200,000 from the NC Division of Water Resources (DWR) for the Middle Fork Greenway, Section 4 and adopt the attached resolution.

WHEREAS, the Watauga County Board of Commissioners desires to sponsor development of the Middle Fork Greenway.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1) The Board requests the State of North Carolina to provide financial assistance to Watauga County for Middle Fork Greenway Section 4 in the amount of \$200,000;
- 2) The Board assumes full obligation for payment of the balance of project costs;
- 3) The Board will obtain all necessary State and Federal permits;
- 4) The Board will comply with all applicable laws governing the award of contracts and the expenditure of public funds by local governments.
- 5) The Board will supervise construction of the project to assure compliance with permit conditions and to assure safe and proper construction according to approved plans and specifications;
- 6) The Board will obtain suitable spoil disposal areas as needed and all other easements or rights-of-way that may be necessary for the construction and operation of the project without cost or obligation to the State;
- 7) The Board will assure that the project is open for use by the public on an equal basis with no restrictions;
- 8) The Board will hold the State harmless from any damages that may result from the construction, operation and maintenance of the project;
- 9) The Board accepts responsibility for the operation and maintenance of the completed project.

Water Resources Development Grant Program – Spring 2017 Guidelines

Administered by: Division of Water Resources (DWR), N.C. Department of Environmental Quality (NCDEQ), 1611 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, N.C., 27699-1611. Phone: (919) 707-9000

Authority: NCDEQ (the department) is authorized to provide grants to local governments for water resources development projects by General Statutes 143-215.70-.73. These statutes can be viewed on the web at the following web address:

http://www.ncleg.net/gascripts/Statutes/StatutesTOC.pl?Chapter=0143

Application Deadlines: Applications are received throughout the year for two standard grant cycles. The spring 2017 grant cycle began Jan. 1 and will end June 30. The fall 2017 grant cycle will begin July 1 and will end Dec. 31.

Who is Eligible: Units of local government and local political subdivisions.

Eligible Purposes and Cost-Share Percentages: The types of projects listed below are eligible for state cost-sharing by the department. The General Assembly placed a 50% matching limit on Water Resources Development Project Grants during their 2011 session. This limit will remain in place until rescinded by the General Assembly. Grants may be made for the nonfederal share of water resources development projects for the following purposes:

- Stream Restoration
- Water Management
- Water-based Recreation Sites
- General Navigation
- Recreational Navigation
- Feasibility or Engineering Study
- NRCS Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) Stream Restoration Projects

Projects planned and constructed by a federal agency with a local cost-share and projects without federal assistance are both eligible for state financial assistance. However, the applicant must be a unit of local government. Non-eligible purposes include compensatory mitigation and the generation of compensatory mitigation credits for impacts to aquatic resources per the Federal Mitigation Rule (33 CFR Part 332). However, compensatory mitigation projects can be located directly adjacent to an eligible project for the purposes of achieving maximum ecological benefit. Projects associated with meeting an existing permit requirement (i.e., Phase I and Phase II Stormwater) and small watershed projects of the Natural Resources Conservation Service (reviewed by the N.C. Soil and Water Conservation Commission) are also not eligible for funding.

Application Package

An application for a Water Resources Development Project Grant (WRDG) should include the six items listed below. All required forms and grant information can be found at the following website: https://deq.nc.gov/about/divisions/water-resources/water-resources-grants/financial-assistance. Please check this website frequently for updates.

- **I.** Electronic Application Form All applications should identify the Project Sponsor (applicant, elected official with signatory authority) and the Primary Contact (applicant's representative responsible for project oversight and management). Contact information for both should include tendigit telephone number and U.S. Postal mailing address, and email address if available. It is the applicant's responsibility to update this information as necessary. We have begun transitioning the application process to a streamlined web-based format which we anticipate being ready for use later this year. Please check our website for updates.
- **II.** Official Resolution The local sponsor shall include a resolution adopted by the governing board stating the amount of state aid requested and accepting the applicant's responsibilities. A representative of the Project Sponsor with signatory authority shall sign this resolution. The following responsibilities shall be included:
 - 1. Assume full obligation for payment of the balance of project costs.
 - 2. Obtain all necessary state and federal environmental permits.
 - 3. Comply with all applicable laws governing the award of contracts and the expenditure of public funds by local governments.
 - 4. Supervise construction of the project to assure compliance with permit conditions and to assure safe and proper construction in accordance with approved plans and specifications.
 - 5. Obtain appropriate easements, rights-of-way or suitable spoil disposal areas that may be necessary for the construction and operation of the project without cost or obligation to the State.
 - 6. Assure that the project is open for use by the public on an equal basis with limited restrictions (if on public property).
 - 7. Hold the state harmless for any damages that may result from the construction, operation, and maintenance of the project.
 - 8. Accept responsibility for operation and long-term maintenance of the completed project.
- **III.** <u>Project Narrative</u> The local sponsor should prepare a brief narrative about the project that begins with a statement outlining the overall project scope (what's being proposed), followed by the project justification (why it's being proposed). Additional supplementary documentation (i.e., reports, photos, letters of support) can be provided as separate attachments. A brief description of the following project elements listed below shall comprise the remainder of the project narrative:
 - Environmental, economic and social benefits provided by implementation of the project. A
 qualitative or quantitative description of benefits shall be listed such as linear feet of stream
 restored/stabilized, acres of stormwater drainage treated or miles of greenway/blueway access
 provided.
 - 2. Regional benefits to an area greater than the area under the jurisdiction of the local sponsoring entity.
 - 3. Potential adverse environmental impacts associated with implementation of the project.

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- 4. Direct benefits to state-owned lands and properties.
- **IV.** Project Plan and Location Map A minimum of two scaled maps is required. The first map shall include the project footprint delineated on a USGS topographic quadrangle map or overlain on recent aerial photography. This map shall be at a small scale (zoomed out) to show the project area within the context of a watershed, county or region. The second map shall be a conceptual plan that describes the location of project elements listed in the project narrative. This map shall be larger scale (zoomed in) to show greater detail within the immediate project area.
- **V.** <u>Project Budget</u> The project budget should identify costs and income by major category in a tabular format. Major categories should also identify income source and whether it is cash or in-kind. In-kind match shall be documented in accordance with the *Reimbursement Directions* found at the WRDG website. Any changes to the project budget and/or project scope will require the written approval of NCDEQ.
- **VI.** <u>No Conflict of Interest Certification</u> Applicants must provide certification that the applicant, applicant's subordinates and any person or persons designated to act on behalf of the applicant do not have an actual or apparent conflict of interest with respect to the project. A representative of the Project Sponsor with signatory authority shall sign this certification.

Grant Application Review and Approval

The following criteria will be used to approve, approve in part, or disapprove grant applications.

- 1. The economic, social, and environmental benefits to be provided by the projects;
- 2. Regional benefits of projects to an area greater than the area under the jurisdiction of the local sponsoring entity;
- 3. The financial resources of the local sponsoring entity;
- 4. The environmental impact of the project;
- 5. Any direct benefit to State-owned lands and properties.

Applicant Obligation – Environmental Documentation

All proposed projects are subject to environmental review and permitting under applicable federal and state laws. It is the applicant's responsibility to prepare and/or provide environmental documentation that might be required for project implementation.

Project Site Visit

As part of the application review process, a site visit will be scheduled to gather additional information regarding the project area to assist the Department in determining if the project meets the applicable review criteria listed in GS §143-215.72.

Projects Not Awarded Funding

Applicants who are not awarded funding within one calendar year from the end date of the grant cycle in which their application was originally submitted must complete and submit a new application to DWR if they wish to re-apply. The spring grant cycle ends on July 1 and the fall cycle ends on Jan. 1 each year.

Post Grant Funding Award

Acceptance of a grant award will require the applicant to enter in to a grant contract with the NCDEQ. Any changes to the scope of the project or project budget will require the written approval of the NCDEQ. A contract amendment may also be required.

Grant awards are valid for two years. The grant contract length will be two years from the date of the NCDEQ executed contract. Grant recipients can submit an extension request for one additional year beyond the grant expiration date if progress toward project completion can be sufficiently documented. An extension request shall be submitted by the project sponsor or primary contact via mail (cover letter on official agency letterhead) or email, and shall briefly document the following items:

- 1. Justification for the extension request
- 2. Summary of the current project status
- 3. Anticipated project schedule moving forward

Disbursement of grant funds will be on a reimbursement basis. Any expenditures incurred associated with the project's budget after the date of the award letter are eligible for reimbursement. Grantees can request 50% of project expenditures through project completion, up to the full amount of the award. Ten percent of the grant award will be retained until a close-out site visit has been completed. Reimbursement request can be submitted no more frequently than monthly. *Attachment 1* is provided below as an example.

Reimbursement request shall include:

- 1. A list of actual cost (expenses) by the approved budget categories
- 2. Total amount spent on the project to date and the amount of the reimbursement request
- 3. Copies of invoices or other documentation for materials, services and other project costs
- 4. The request should be signed and dated by the project officer

Grant Payments

The department will normally pay the grantee by check or electronically within 30 days of receipt of the statement of expenses, provided the expenses are in accordance with the project information shown in the initial request or as amended.

If the grantee decides that significant changes to a project are necessary, the grantee must send a request **in writing** to DWR and receive approval of those changes from the DWR. **Unapproved changes will not be eligible for state cost-sharing**.

Grant funds will be available for use by the grant recipient for two years from the grant contract execution date. The contract may be extended for up to one year if the grantee requests such an extension **in writing**, and the DWR approves this request **in writing**.

Project Close-Out

Upon notification of project completion from the grantee, DWR will arrange an inspection of the completed project. A staff member of DWR together with a representative of the grantee will normally carry out the inspection. However, DWR may substitute its personnel with that of other state or federal agencies that are located closer to the project to minimize the state's costs. Inspection will verify that construction was done in accordance with the approved plans and specifications.

If a project required a Section 404/401 permit application, the applicant shall provide DWR with a scaled version of the permit drawings or 'as-built' drawing(s) electronically in an Adobe PDF format prior to the close-out site visit. Applicants who are awarded funding for Feasibility/Engineering Studies shall provide DWR with the associated summary report(s) and deliverables in an electronic format.

After the project is inspected and accepted, DWR will review the accounting statements and request the department to pay the final 10% of the departments share of the non-federal cost.

The fifth request is for a 2017 John Deere utility vehicle to replace a 2002 Gator for the Parks and Recreation Department. NC State contract for a John Deere utility vehicle is \$12,490 which includes a 16% discount on total selling price. Mountaineer Equipment Company in Newland is the closest John Deere dealer and honors the state contract pricing.

Board approval to purchase a 2017 John Deere utility vehicle at a cost of \$12,490 is requested.

The sixth request is to purchase replacement radios for the Sheriff's Office and Emergency Management.
