MINUTES

WATAUGA COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TUESDAY, DECEMBER 17, 2013

The Watauga County Board of Commissioners held a regular meeting on Tuesday, December 17, 2013, at 5:30 P.M. in the Commissioners' Board Room of the Watauga County Administration Building, Boone, North Carolina.

Chairman Miller called the meeting to order at 5:30 P.M.

Due to the size of attendance, Chairman Miller recessed the meeting to Courtroom #1 located in the Courthouse at 842 West King Street, Boone, North Carolina which was next door to the Administration Building.

Chairman Miller reconvened the meeting at 5:44 P.M. in Courtroom # 1.

Vice-Chairman Blust opened the meeting with a prayer and Commissioner Yates led the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Chairman Miller called for additions and/or corrections to the December 3, 2013, regular meeting and closed session minutes.

Commissioner Yates, seconded by Commissioner Kennedy, moved to approve the December 3, 2013, regular meeting minutes as presented.

Commissioner Yates, seconded by Commissioner Kennedy, moved to approve the December 3, 2013, closed session minutes as presented.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Chairman Miller called for additions and/or corrections to the December 17, 2013, agenda.

Commissioner Kennedy, seconded by Vice-Chairman Blust, moved to approve the December 3, 2013, agenda as presented.

VOTE: Aye-5 Nay-0

COVE CREEK PRESERVATION AND DEVELOPMENT (CCP&D) REQUEST

Mr. Jack Simpson representing Cove Creek Preservation and Development (CCP&D), which leases the Old Cove Creek School from the County, shared concerns of drainage issues at the property and requested the County's help to understand what needed to be done to fix the underlying problems.

County Manager Deron Geouque stated that CCP&D was requesting to use County personnel and equipment to resolve outside drainage issues in the back of the building by re-grading the area to create positive drainage and the removal of one breezeway. It appeared that much of the underneath moisture was attributable to the surface drainage issues in the back of the building. Staff concurred that the surface drainage needed to be addressed but understood that it would be difficult due to the topography of the property. Additionally, the water issues underneath the building could be a result of wet weather springs and would require CCP&D to address during the drying and conditioning of the 9,000 square foot crawl space. Staff would be hesitant to make any guarantees that this work will alleviate the current situation but it would be a step toward the solution of the ongoing drainage issues.

The County Manager stated that the estimated cost to perform the repairs and utilize County staff was approximately \$7,000 which included equipment rental, materials and supplies, and construction administration from Mr. Mike Wilson, TOYHSMA Construction Consulting Services. Another option would be for the County to hire an engineer to review the drainage at the site and develop a plan of action. However, the latter option could cost \$12,000 for the plan with additional costs depending on the course of action selected.

Commissioner Yates, seconded by Commissioner Welch, moved to approve the allocation of \$7,000 from the administrative contingency to cover the estimated cost to perform the repairs and utilize County staff which includes equipment rental, materials and supplies, and construction administration by Mr. Mike Wilson with TOYHSMA Construction Consulting Services.

NORTH CAROLINA AGRICULTURAL TRUST FUND GRANT REQUEST

Mr. Brian Chatham with Watauga County Soil and Water Conservation stated that his Department along with Cooperative Extension requested authorization to apply for a \$36,300 grant from the North Carolina Agricultural Trust Fund. The grant required a fifteen percent (15%) match in cash and/or in-kind services. Mr. Chatham requested to appropriate \$3,000 from the multiflora rose program. The Board recently approved \$4,000 from the multiflora rose program at the September 17, 2013 meeting for a digital scale/portable head gate. Approximately \$3,500 remained unspent in the multiflora rose program funds.

Mr. Chatham stated that Mr. Jim Hamilton, Cooperative Extension Director, proposed the grant match be \$3,000 in cash (from the multiflora rose program) and \$2,445 from Cooperative Extension and Soil and Water salaries for in-kind services. Due to the grant application deadline of Monday, December 16, 2013, the County Manager authorized submittal of the grant with the understanding that the County could withdraw should the Commissioners not approve the request.

Vice-Chairman Blust, seconded by Commissioner Kennedy, moved to approve the submission of the grant application in the amount of \$36,300 to the North Carolina Agricultural Trust Fund with a \$5,445 match which included \$3,000 in cash (allocated from the multiflora rose program funds) and \$2,445 from in-kind services.

Vice-Chairman Blust, seconded by Commissioner Yates, moved to hold the public hearing scheduled for 6:00 P.M. at this time and then continue with remaining agenda items at the completion of the hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING TO ALLOW CITIZEN COMMENT ON THE TOWN OF BEECH MOUNTAIN'S PROPOSED NEW WATER INTAKE ON THE WATAUGA RIVER

Per Commissioner request, a public hearing was scheduled to seek citizen input on the Town of Beech Mountain's proposed water intake on the Watauga River. The hearing was advertised and a mailing was sent to potentially affected property owners. Mr. Robert Heaton, Beech Mountain Public Utilities Director, along with consultant, Mr. Lee Spencer, gave an informational presentation on the Town's proposed water intake project and requested the County's support of the project. The intake would be located on the Watauga River near Guy Ford Road and a line to transport the raw water to the Town's treatment plant would also be constructed to serve as a secondary source of water during periods of drought.

Commissioner Yates, seconded by Vice-Chairman Blust, moved to declare the public hearing open at 6:19 P.M. to allow citizen comment on the Town of Beech Mountain's proposed water intake on the Watauga River.

REQUEST TO ACCEPT ADDITIONAL FY 2014 SENIOR HEALTH INSURANCE INFORMATION PROGRAM (SHIIP) FUNDS/CONTRACT

Ms. Angie Boitnotte, Project on Aging Director, will request the Board accept a grant for additional funding from the Senior's Health Insurance Information Program (SHIIP). The grant funding would be used to conduct two (2) outreach clinics and the purchase of a new computer for SHIPP volunteers to use. The amount of the grant is \$1,739 and does not require a County match.

Commissioner Kennedy, seconded by Commissioner Yates, moved to accept the additional FY 2014 Senior Health Insurance Program (SHIIP) grant funds in the amount of \$1,739 and approve the associated contract as presented.

A. Monthly Collections Report

MISCELLANEOUS ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

A. Proposed Lease for Probation and Parole

County Manager Geouque stated that the State of North Carolina began requiring counties to furnish space at no cost for court-related functions several years ago. Prior to that time, the County was paid rent for Probation and Parole Offices. Even though the County does not currently receive rent, the Department of Public Safety required that a lease be executed detailing the stipulations. Staff requested a revised lease several months prior to the October 30, 2013, expiration date. The County Manager presented a proposed lease which was provided to the County on December 9, 2013.

Chairman Miller questioned the need for a lease due to there not being formal leases with other State Agencies housed, as required, in County-owned facilities.

Commissioner Yates, seconded by Vice-Chairman Blust, moved to table further discussion to allow the County Attorney to research the need for a lease.

VOTE: Aye-5 Nay-0

B. Resolution Requesting the North Carolina General Assembly Adequately Fund the Cooperative Extensions throughout the State

County Manager Geouque stated that, per Commissioner direction, a resolution was drafted requesting the North Carolina General Assembly recognize the contributions of the Cooperative Extensions throughout the State and fund them at sustainable levels keeping the Extensions viable and vibrant. The Extensions have experienced budget cuts, over the last decade, which have significantly impacted their ability to provide services and support to their communities.

Commissioner Yates, seconded by Commissioner Welch, moved to adopt the Resolution in Support of North Carolina Cooperative Extension Services for Watauga County as presented.

VOTE: Aye-5 Nay-0

C. Renewal of JLW Enterprises, Inc. Contract for Inmate Care

County Manager Geouque stated that the contract with JLW Enterprises, Inc. for inmate care expired November 30, 2013. The contract was previously with Competent Correctional Care, Inc., however the Board agreed to the assignment of the contract to JLW Enterprises, Inc. as recommended by the Sheriff. The County Manager stated that the Sheriff's Office had been working on the proposed renewal which included a Consumer Price Index (CPI) increase of four percent (4%). The current monthly contract price of \$7,578 would increase to \$7,881.12 (equivalent to an additional \$303.12 per month). The contract required written notification from both parties to renew the contract for an additional year. The County Manager stated that,

although unable to attend, the Sheriff's Office had recommended the renewal of the contract and adequate funds were in the jail budget to cover the increase.

Chairman Miller instructed staff to request the Sheriff present written contracts for review prior to seeking approval.

Chairman Miller, seconded by Commissioner Yates, moved to enter into an extension of the agreement including a four percent (4%) Consumer Price Index (CPI) increase with the same contract extension to Competent Correctional Care, Inc., substituted to JLW Enterprises, Inc., in a contract drafted by the County Attorney with the exact changes as specified in the motion.

VOTE: Aye-5 Nay-0

D. Boards & Commissions

County Manager Geouque stated that the terms of Recreation Commission members representing the Blowing Rock, Mabel, and Cove Creek elementary school districts as well as three Town of Boone representatives were set to expire in December. Parks and Recreation Director, Stephen Poulos, has requested recommendations for appointments to fill these positions.

Cove Creek Principal, Toby Cone, wishes to represent the Cove Creek School district.

Blowing Rock Principal, Patrick Sukow, recommends the reappointment of Wendell Ellis as the Blowing Rock School district representative.

Other recommendations will be forwarded for consideration upon receipt.

The above were first readings and, therefore, no action was required.

County Manager Geouque stated that one appointment was needed to the Watauga County Board of Adjustment (which meets infrequently). The two zoned areas of the County (Valle Crucis and Foscoe-Grandfather) must be represented on the Board; traditionally an attempt was made to appoint representatives of watershed protection areas as well. The term of Jane Nicholson has expired and she did not wish to be reappointed. Technically, the available seat was an at-large representative, though Ms. Nicholson also resided in one of the watershed protection areas. Other Board of Adjustment members represent Valle Crucis, Foscoe-Grandfather, Howards Creek watershed, and Middle Fork watershed. The term would be for three years. No applications have been received to date.

Chairman Miller stated that an application had been received from Clinton Coffey for consideration as an Extra-Territorial Jurisdiction member of the Town of Boone's Board of Adjustment; however, an official recommendation had not yet been received from the Town of Boone.

County Manager Geouque stated that Audrey Tate has resigned from the Social Services Advisory Board with her attendance at the December 18 meeting to end her tenure. Social Services Director, Jim Atkinson, recommended Lynn Jackson Patterson for appointment to fill the unexpired term. Mr. Atkinson has forwarded a volunteer application to Ms. Patterson for her to complete and return.

Consideration of Ms. Patterson was tabled until receipt of a volunteer application.

E. Announcements

County Manager Geouque announced that the first regular meeting in January 2014 has been cancelled due to the holiday schedule. Therefore, the only regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners scheduled in January will be held on the 21st at 5:30 P.M.

David Hagaman and Opal Greaybeal had signed up to speak; however, neither was present when called.

Deborah Greene stated that a citizens group had been formed that would work together when rights were under attack.

HIGH COUNTRY COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS' REQUEST FOR SUPPORT OF THE URGENT REPAIR PROGRAM

MANAGER'S COMMENTS:

Michelle Ball, regional planner with High Country Council of Governments, will present a proposal to apply for funds from the North Carolina Housing Finance Agency's Urgent Repair Program. The request is due to the CDBG Scattered Site Housing Program being eliminated with conclusion of the current funding cycle.

Should the application be approved, a multi-county housing repair program would be established and administered by the High Country Council of Governments. Ms. Ball will be present to answer any questions. A letter of support and summary of the grant program is included.

There is no local match requirement. Board approval is requested to allow the High Country Council of Governments to submit an application to the North Carolina Housing Finance Agency for a multi-county Urgent Repair Program which replaces the soon to be defunct CDBG Scattered Site Housing Program.

Urgent Repair Program (URP)

High Country Council of Governments (HCCOG) will be applying to the North Carolina Housing Finance Agency (NCHFA) for funding for an Urgent Repair Program (URP). Funding for this NCHFA program is competitive. HCCOG's application will cover a multi-county area within their region including Alleghany, Ashe, Avery, and Watauga Counties. The URP program is intended to complement existing and/or proposed housing programs in these counties. HCCOG will be asking for \$200,000 in funding.

Highlights of the URP Program:

- Eligible applicants must:
 - ✓ Be low- or moderate-income (priority given to those under 30% of the area median income, as determined by HUD.)
 - ✓ Own the home or have life-time rights
 - ✓ Fall into one of five special needs categories:
 - lack elderly (over 62)
 - disabled
 - > single-parent household
 - ➤ large household (5 or more occupants)
 - have a small child with a high blood lead level.
- Repair costs per home may not exceed \$8,000.
- Unlike other rehabilitation/repair projects the house does not have to be brought to a certain code or standard. The focus is on the needed repair not the house as a whole. However, any repairs completed with program funds will be done to NC Building Code.
- The goal of the Urgent Repair Program is to provide repairs to a home which pose an imminent threat to the life or safety of the homeowner or their ability to remain in their homes independently.
- Eligible repairs include:
 - ✓ A new roof
 - ✓ Electrical repair
 - ✓ Plumbing repair
 - ✓ Replacement of broken windows or doors
 - ✓ Floor repair
 - ✓ HVAC repair/replacement
 - ✓ On-site septic system repair/installation
 - ✓ On-site well repair/installation
 - ✓ Hook up to public utilities or repair of supply lines to public utilities
 - ✓ Handicapped ramp
 - ✓ Handicapped conversion of existing bathroom
- High Country Council of Governments will be the applicant, not the County.
- The County will have no financial burden, nor will the County Finance Office be utilized.
- The County will not be responsible for advertising the program to the public.
- The County will be asked to keep their existing Housing Advisory Committee to assist High Country Council with word-of –mouth marketing and to help identify eligible homeowners.

A. Proposed Amendments to the Ambulance Franchise Agreement

MANAGER'S COMMENTS:

The Board approved the addition of a twelve (12) hour ambulance crew for Fiscal Year 2014. In conjunction with the additional crew, staff was able to have Watauga Medics agree to waive the CPI increase for 2014. The proposed contract reflects the additional twelve (12) hour crew and the waiving of the CPI escalator for 2014. The contract has an effective date of January 1, 2014 and runs through December 31, 2019.

North Carolina General Statute 153A-46 requires a grant, renewal, extension, or amendment of any franchise to be passed at two regular meetings of the Board of Commissioners before it may be adopted. As this is the first reading, no action is required at this time and the contract will be presented to the Board at the February 4, 2014 meeting for adoption.

AMBULANCE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT

COUNTY OF WATAUGA

THIS AMBULANCE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT (hereinafter "Agreement") is made and entered onto this the 1st- day of January 20132014 by and between WATAUGA COUNTY, a body politic, organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of North Carolina (hereinafter the "County"), and WATAUGA MEDICS, INC., a North Carolina corporation, (hereinafter "Franchisee").

WHEREAS, effective October 4, 1999, the Watauga County Board of Commissioners, by authority contained in NC.G.S, 153A-250, adopted Ordinance Number XXX, titled the "Watauga County Ambulance Franchise Ordinance" (hereinafter the "Ordinance"); and

WHEREAS, County and Franchisee executed an Ambulance Franchise Agreement dated November 16, 2004, pursuant to the Watauga County Ambulance Franchise Ordinance, Ordinance Number XXX, pursuant to the authority granted to the County by NCGS 153-250; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said Ordinance, the County issued a Request For Proposal (hereinafter the "RFP") soliciting bids and specifying certain minimum conditions of any franchise to be issued pursuant thereto; and

WHEREAS, Craig J. Sullivan, on behalf of Watauga Medics, Inc., submitted a written bid entitled *Bid Proposal for Watauga County Ambulance Service* (hereinafter the "Bid") pursuant to said RFP; and

WHEREAS, the County, at its November 1, 2004, meeting resolved to accept the Bid Option 3-1 contained in said bid, to wit: that the bidder will provide service (as further specified below) with the County to provide an annual subsidy of as set forth below in monthly installment; and

WHEREAS, at the February 20, 2007, meeting of the Watauga County Board of County Commissioners, the County agreed to amend the agreement to clarify and restated the subsidy payment that were paid or are to be paid pursuant to the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the parties have discussed an extension of the Agreement between the County and Franchisee in an effort to lock-in costs to the County and allow for the Franchisee to expand his operations to improve services in Watauga County.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual benefits and obligations set forth below, the County and the Franchisee agree as follows:

1. The County does hereby grant unto Franchisee a non-exclusive franchise for the operation of an ambulance service for the provision of emergency and

non-emergency medical transport services, in accordance with the Ordinance, the RFP, the bid and this Agreement for a period of seven years.

- 2. This franchise may not be sold, assigned or transferred nor may it in any way vest in any person, firm or corporation, other than the Franchisee and any such sale, transfer or assignment shall cause this franchise to terminate immediately, at the opinion of Watauga County.
- 3. Any change in legal or equitable ownership of Franchisee, its corporate shares, or any of its equipment shall immediately terminate the Franchise, at the option of Watauga County.
- 4. The initial term of the Franchise shall be from 12:00 A.M. on January 1, 20132014, and through and including the 31st day of December, 2019. Either party, for any reason, may with or without cause terminate this agreement and the Franchise upon one hundred eighty (180) calendar days written notice to the other party, unless sooner terminated for reasons set forth in the Ordinance or by agreement of the parties hereto.
- 5. At the end of the aforesaid term, unless the parties agree otherwise in writing or either party has given notice of termination as aforesaid, the Franchise and all of the terms of this Agreement (subject to any amendments as may be entered into) shall be automatically renewed for continuing one-year terms.
- 6. The Franchise shall provide all personnel, vehicles, supplies and equipment to provide all emergency and non-emergency ambulance service necessary in all parts of Watauga County on a 24 hour per day, 7 day per week basis, at not less than an EMT-Paramedic level of service (except so long as an agreement for such acceptable to the County is in place, the Franchise may provide ambulance service to the Flat Springs area of Avery County in exchange for Avery County's providing pursuant to agreement with Franchise ambulance service to the Town of Beech Mountain in Watauga County). Each ambulance of the Franchisee shall be available to render assistance to all portions of Watauga County.
- 7. Franchisee shall keep two (2) two-wheel drive ambulances and two (2) four-wheel drive ambulances fully equipped, licensed and available for emergency and non-emergency service at all times, subject to routine maintenance down time. As of January 1, 2014, Franchisee shall keep twothree of the ambulances manned and available on a 24 hour per day, 7 day per week basis and a third-fourth ambulance manned and available nine hours per day, Monday through Saturday, six (6) days per week. Not less than two (2) ambulances will be kept within the County at all times for services pursuant to this Agreement, one of which will be manned and the other of which will be manned or will have personnel on call for immediate service. Each ambulance necessary to meet the foregoing requirements shall have less than 50,000 miles on it at the time initially put in service by Franchisee. The

Franchisee will immediately notify the County in writing of any additions or deletions to its inventory of operational ambulances. Franchise shall employ a fourth ambulance and crew to work seven days per week, twelve hours per day. In additional new service for Watauga County, and the Franchisee shall strive not to place or dispatch said fourth crew for service outside the territorial jurisdiction of Watauga County except for emergency transports, when any of Franchisee's other crew is away on a routine transport. As of July 1, 2005, Franchisee will provide an additional on call crew to respond to out of county emergency transports between the hours of 8:00 P.M. and 8:00 A.M. seven (7) days per week.

- 8. The Franchisee shall maintain not less than two (2) bases, the first of which will be provided by the County as set forth below. The Franchisee must bear all responsibility for finding other station(s) and the costs associated with acquiring, equipping, and maintaining such.
- 9. Franchisee's first base of operations will be located at the facilities owned by the County at 921 West King Street, Boone, North Carolina 28607, or such other location as may be provided by the County. The County will make available, at no charge to Franchisee, said the said facilities currently located at 921 West King Street, Boone, North Carolina 28607, specifically consisting of 5,263 square feet, including a garage, offices, sleeping area and a training room. The County shall provide property and casualty hazard insurance for the structure at said location. The Franchisee must bear all utilities, maintenance, medical supplies, equipment and other necessary expenses associated with said facilities provided by the County. Franchisee's obligation to provide maintenance to the structure shall be limited to repairs of ordinary wear and tear to the reasonable satisfaction of the County. Franchisee's two propane heaters and the lift located in the-the bay area of the building shall remain the property of Franchisee, so long as Franchisee repairs any damage to the building caused by their removal.
- 10. The Franchisee shall maintain a second base to be located at 133 Longvue Dr., Boone, North Carolina 28607 and the Franchisee shall be solely responsible for providing all things necessary for operation of the service at the second base, including but not limited to the building, utilities, maintenance, medical supplies, equipment and necessary operational expenses associated with the facilities.
- 11. Each ambulance used by Franchisee must be in compliance with all applicable Federal, State, and local laws relating to personnel, health, safety, equipment, vehicle design, and sanitation. Franchisee shall keep the County provided with a copy of the current State certification for each ambulance owned or operated by Franchisee.
- The Franchisee shall be responsible for all future capital purchase and all operational, including (but not limited to) salaries, employee benefits and expenses, insurance, mobile operational costs, and all other fees, expenses,

and charges necessary to remain in compliance with the County's ordinance and the franchise granted to the Franchisee.

E-verify. The Contractor shall ensure its compliance with Title IV, Subtitle A, of the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996, Pub. L. 104-208, 110 Stat. 3009 and Article 2 of Chapter 64 of the North Carolina General Statutes. Contractor shall provide all documentation which may be requested by the County, including but not limited to completion of Form I-9 for Employment Eligibility Verification, affidavits of compliance with this act, and such other documentation as the County may request from time to time. The Contractor shall not knowingly hire for employment, employ, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien.

- 42.13. The Franchisee shall provide the County with a list of all of its equipment which is in service, on not less than an annual basis, and the Franchisee shall assure that all of its equipment in use will be removed from service once it becomes obsolete or needs to be replaced due to normal wear and tear.
- 13.14. Each ambulance of Franchisee shall be equipped with an eight (8) channel VHF radio. Frequencies shall be assigned by the Communications Center designated by the County. Franchisee shall relay all ambulance movements to the Communications Center designated by the County, via two-way radio.
- 14.15. The Franchisee shall assure that its EMS personnel have access to operational Franchisee-issued pagers, or other communication devices along with accurate phone lists are on file to notify said personnel if the regular squads of the Franchisee are unable to handle the volume of calls that may come in from time fromto time.

45.16. The Franchisee shall at all times meet the following performance standards:

- a. The average response time for an ambulance, calculated on a Monthly basis, shall not exceed ten minutes.
- b. The Franchisee shall place no required ambulance in service for initial operation that has more than 50,000 miles.
- 46.17. The Franchisee shall not allow any paramedic to practice in Watauga County until he or she has passed an oral examination given by a panel of the Medical Director and unless he or she holds current certifications in advanced training courses specified by the Medical Director. It will be the responsibility of the Franchisee to coordinate with Watauga County to ensure a qualified Medical Director remains active in the system.
- 47.18. The Franchisee shall enter into and assure the existence of mutual aid agreements with ambulance services in counties adjoining Watauga County to provide assistance in the event of disaster or other special need, said agreements to be at the sole expense of the Franchisee. Additionally, the

Franchisee shall implement and keep in place a Reserve Program, creating a County-wide manpower bank to be available in the event of a disaster or other special need. All training will be open to Reserves and any other individuals with NC Basic EMT Certification, or higher, who also meet Franchisees other reasonably developed standards. The Franchisee shall make all reasonable efforts to provide "ride time" to said reserves, to keep their skills current.

- 18.19. Franchisee shall enter into mutual aid agreements to have and make available assistance of and to all volunteer rescue squads in the County when requested by the County, the Franchisee or the volunteer rescue squads.
- 49.20. The Franchisee shall make its resources available to Watauga County Emergency Management Office during its emergency activities, and during any declared State of Emergency shall work in conjunction with the Emergency Operations Center.
- 20.21. The Franchisee shall oversee a First Responder program, which the Franchisee will assist the local fire departments with the needs of the program. The Franchisee shall assist in the development and implementation of operating guidelines for the program, and shall restock the supplies (not to include capital equipment or any drugs such as epi pens) used in the services of the First Responder. Further, the Franchisee shall coordinate continuing education requests and other training for all First Responders, as appropriate. All of the foregoing shall be provided to the program and First Responders at no cost to the First Responders or their sponsoring agency or agencies, all with no additional cost to the County.
- 21.22. The Franchisee shall operate on a fee for services basis, and shall only issue the following charges (when incurred) at the following rates, which are hereby approved by the County:

a. Rates for BLS calls: \$300.0

b.	Rates for ALS calls:	(non-emergency)	\$350.00
		(Emergency)	\$385.00
		ALS II:	\$550.00

c. Charge per mile: \$8.<mark>50</mark>

d. Waiting time per hour (after first hour) \$25.00

e. No transport calls:

A charge of \$50.00 is authorized for no transport calls when Franchisee responds to assist patients who just need assistance or patients who have initiated a 911 call and have changed their mind once Franchisee arrived.

No charge under this subsection may be assessed when a 911 call is made by a bystander without the request of the injured party.

No other fees, expenses, or charges may be made without prior Resolution of the County's Board of Commissioners approving such.

- 22.23. The Franchisee shall be responsible for billing and collection of its fees, charges and expenses. The Franchisee must submit for payment from, third-party payers and accept assignment of Medicare and Medicaid Franchisee shall maintain accurate records of its charges and reimbursements from Medicare and other sources of all charges pursuant to the foregoing authorized increases, and shall compile and maintain such information in a form useful to the County, which information shall be shared from time to time with the County, as the County may desire.
- 23.24. Franchisee shall maintain all records required by Sect-Section XII of the Ordinance and shall submit to the County by the 15th of the month following each quarter a data sheet containing all of the information specified in subsection f of said Section of the Ordinance. The Franchisee shall submit an annual report containing all of the information required by said Section and further specified by subsection g of said Section by the 15th day of the month following the last quarter of each year. The Franchisee shall maintain the aforesaid records in an organized fashion, and allow the County full access to said information as the County deems appropriate. By the 15th of May of each year, the Franchisee shall submit to the County manager a budget of how it intends to spend the County's funds in the upcoming fiscal year, and within ninety (90) days of the end of the Franchisee's fiscal year, the Franchisee shall furnish the County a full and complete certified audit of Franchisee's operations conducting by a CPA in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards of Franchises's operations, which shall include a fully-audited financial statement of the Franchisee. The Franchisee's fiscal year shall be from 1 January to 31 December of each year.
- 24.25. Each year, Franchisee shall provide the County a detailed explanation of its billing policies, sufficient to allow County to fully understand the billing methods and practices of the Franchisee.
- <u>25.26.</u> Franchisee shall fully allow the County to inspect all records, premises and equipment of the Franchisee at any time in order to confirm and insure compliance with the ordinance and the franchise granted herein.
- 26.27. In providing ambulance service as described herein the Franchisee shall comply with all laws of the United States, the State of North Carolina and the County of Watauga, including rules and regulations promulgated by the Medical Care Commission and the NC Medical Board, and resolutions and ordinances of the Watauga County Board of Commissioners. Further, the Franchisee shall abide by all applicable US and North Carolina Labor labor laws, including, but not limited to, Occupational Safety and Health

regulations, Fair Labor Standards Act and the Americans with Disabilities Act and regulations pursuant thereto. The County shall have the right to inspect all records pertaining to these labor laws and ensure compliance by the Franchisee. The Franchisee shall maintain records on all employee training conducted pursuant to Occupational Safety and Health regulations and shall make these available to the County upon request

- 27.28. Franchisee shall maintain in place an escrow account, a surety bond, an irrevocable letter of credit, or other guarantee or undertaking satisfactory to the County attorney, in an amount equal to the amount of the contract subsidy applicable to any one hundred eighty (180) day period following the date such obligation may arise to assure payment to the County for any liability of the Franchisee to the County arising out of this Agreement, of the Ordinance, or of Franchisee's operation, and to pay for any substitute performance the County may cause to be provided upon Franchisees default in performance hereunder or under the Ordinance.
- 28.29. The Franchisee agrees and acknowledges that the above-referenced facilities of the County located at 921 West King Street, Boone, North Carolina are fully adequate facilities for the housing of their base operation at said location.
- 29.30. For the period of this agreement, the County shall prepay to Franchisee an annual subsidy in monthly installments as follows:

(this amount to be adjusted by the CPI as explained below. Each year thereafter the previous year's amount will be adjusted as explained below: For each subsequent year after January 1, 2015, the base amount will be adjusted as explained below:

On each January 1, commencing on January 1, 2014, the agreed-upon County subsidy shall be adjusted and revised as follows:

a. 60 percent of the adjustment shall reflect the annual increase or decrease of the Consumer Price Index (CPI), South Urban Size C, as published by the US Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.

- 20 percent of the adjustment shall reflect the annual increase or decrease of the CPI, Medical Care Services as published by the US Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.
- c. 20 percent of the adjustment shall reflect the annual increase or decrease of the CPI, Transportation, as published by the US Department if Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.

In the event the CPI components produce a negative adjustment, once totaled, the Subsidy amount will not be adjusted. In the event the CPI components produce a percentage greater than 6% the annual increase will be 6% plus on-half (50%) of the amount over 6% up to 10% (For Example, if the CPI escalator is computed at 7.4% the annual increase would be 6.7% or $6\% + .50 \times 1.4 = 6.7$). Any amount over 10% will not be considered for adjustment, i.e. the maximum adjustment will be 8%. Or $6\% + .50 \times 4\% = 8\%$).

- 30.31. The County will calculate the adjustment based upon the most recent November annual report of Franchisee as compared to the report of the previous November. (For example, the January 1, 2014, adjustment will reflect the CPI changes between November 2012 and November 2013.)
- 31.32. Franchisee shall at all times during the existence of the Franchise, keep in full force and effect the insurance coverage as required by Section X of the Ordinance entitled "Insurance" and all insurance required by law, including liability insurance on its vehicles and workers' compensation coverage for its personnel. Franchisee shall provide proof of coverage to the County and to assure that each insurance policy contains provisions that assure that the County receives at least 90 days prior notice from each carrier of any lapses, cancellations, denials, changes or limitations in coverage. The County shall be shown as an additional insured on all of Franchisee's liability insurance.
- 32.33. The Franchisee shall indemnify and hold harmless the County and its officers and employees from and against all suits, actions, liability, claims, demands, judgments, recoveries or expenses, including court costs and attorney's fees, against or incurred by the County on account of or in any way connected with or arising from any claim of injury, loss or damage which arises out of or is in any manner connected with Franchisee's operations; including, but not limited to any claim or injury, loss or damage, suit, action, liability, claim, demand, judgment, recovery, or expense caused or alleged to be caused in whole or in part by any negligent act, omission, error, professional error, mistake, accident or other fault of the Franchisee, any subcontractor of the Franchisee, or an officer, employee or agent of the Franchisee.
- 33.34. Franchisee is to provide ambulance service as an independent contractor and neither Franchise nor any of its personnel shall be an employee, agent or representative of the County in any way.

- 34.35. The Franchisee and its agents, contractors and subcontractors shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, creed, national origin, ancestry, age, sex, religion or disability in any policy or practice and Franchisee shall assure that any agreements or practices it enters into or engages in expressly provide for such nondiscrimination.
- 35.36. This Agreement is entered into pursuant to the RFP which Franchisee acknowledges; to the Ordinance and all amendments as may be made thereto, which Franchisee is and will remain familiar with and agrees to fully abide by; to the bid by Watauga Medics, Inc., and to the County's resolutions of November 1, 2004, accepting said bid. Except to the extent this Agreement imposes standards above the minimum standards specified in the Ordinance, in the event of any inconsistency among or between the foregoing, the Ordinance shall control and as between this Agreement and the RFP, the Bid, and the Resolution, this Agreement shall control, but all of the terms of the aforesaid documents not inconsistent with the other documents shall remain in and have full force and effect.
- 36.37. Should any portion of this Agreement be ruled or determined invalid, such invalidity shall not effect the enforceability of the remaining portions hereof. This Agreement shall not be amended or modified except in writing, signed by all parties hereto, with the County's consent to such modification to be only by prior resolution of its Board of Commissioners.

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE SHERIFF'S SALARY

WHEREAS, filing for the office of Watauga County Sheriff begins on Monday, February 10, 2014, at 12:00 noon; and

WHEREAS, the deadline for filing is Friday, February 28, 2014, at 12:00 noon; and

WHEREAS, the Watauga County Board of Commissioners desires to adopt a new salary for the office of Sheriff pursuant to North Carolina General Statutes 153A-92 at a rate of \$67,585 for the next term of office of the then Sheriff; and

WHEREAS, this resolution is made more than fourteen (14) days before the last day of filing notice of candidacy for this office.

Per request, I have reviewed the proposed changes to the Town of Boone Unified Development Ordinance in regards to the appointment of representatives of the Extra-Territorial Jurisdiction (ETJ) for the Town of Boone. While the proposed changes are an improvement, they still attempt to impose burdens upon the Board of Commissioners which are beyond their authority as a municipality to impose. I have no objection on a legal basis of the language to be stricken from the existing ordinance, but I would recommend the following changes in addition to those proposed by the Town of Boone to provide for compliance with State law and my understanding of your agreement with the Town of Boone.

1. Under Section 2.01.02(C)2(b)ii the proposed ordinance states that the Board of Commissioners 'shall only appoint a person to the Board[of Adjustments] after it had [sic] received the resolution from the Council requesting the appointment.' Under this language, the Town Council could simply withhold any individual being nominated or appointed by the County Commissioners by refusing or failing to pass a resolution asking the County to fill the seat. This is beyond the statutory authority of the Town Council and could be used to prevent representation on the Board of Adjustments for the ETJ jurisdictions.

I would propose replacing this language and the following subsection 2.01.02(C)2(b)iii as follows: "So long as the Town Council has not passed a resolution requesting the County Commissioners make an appointment to the Board of Adjustments, the County shall wait sixty days prior to making an appointment from the date of notice by the Clerk of a vacancy as set forth in Section 2.01.02(C)2(a)ii of the UDO to allow the Town Council an opportunity to make recommendations for appointment."

2. Under 2.01.02(C)2(b)iv and 2.01.02(C)2(b)v, the procedure for the County to make appointments to a Board of Adjustments is the same as for other appointments, and is set by State statute. The proposed instructions on how to make and consider appointments by the Town of Boone is beyond their

statutory authority and could lead to inconsistencies in procedures and potential legal disputes.

I would propose replacing this language with the following: "The Board of Commissioners shall make its appointment in accordance with N.C. Gen. Stat. § 153A-45."

3. Under 2.01.02(C)2(b)viii, the present ordinance does not delete the previous definition of 'a qualified person,' in accordance with your agreement with the Town of Boone. The existing definition of the Town of Boone exceeds the statutory authority of the Town of Boone and is contrary to the language of the general statutes.

I would propose replacing this language with the following: "The Board of Commissioners shall appoint a qualified person as defined by N.C. Gen. Stat. § 160A-362."

4. I would recommend that these changes mirror the changes to the Planning Commission as set forth in 2.02.01.

I hope these suggestions are helpful to you in resolving this matter appropriately.

2.01.01 The Board is a quasi-judicial body which acts on specified appeals, variances, and major subdivision preliminary plat approval and special use permit requests. Except for major subdivision preliminary plat approval, the decisions by the Board represent the final decision by the Town.

2.01.02 Appointment and Terms of Board of Adjustment

- A. Number of Members: There shall be a Board of Adjustment consisting of eight (8) regular members and eight (8) alternates. Alternates shall serve on the Board in the absence or temporary disqualification of any regular member or to fill a vacancy pending appointment of a member. Each alternate, while attending any regular or special meeting of the Board and serving on behalf of any regular member, shall have and may exercise all the powers and duties of a regular member.
 - 1. Number of Town Members: Five (5) regular members of the Board of Adjustment and five (5) alternates shall reside within the Town (hereafter, "resident members").
 - 2. Number of ETJ Members: Three (3) regular members and three (3) alternates shall reside within the Town's ETJ. Should the Town's ETJ be expanded or the ratio of the population of the ETJ relative to the population of the Town increase or decrease, in accordance with N. C. Gen. Stat. §160A-362 and as specified herein, the Town will adjust the number of members from the ETJ in order to maintain proportional representation based on population for residents of the ETJ relative to the Town. However, the resident members may never number fewer than five (5) regular members and five (5) alternates, so if necessary to maintain proportionality, the full size of the Board shall be increased. So long as the Town exercises extraterritorial jurisdiction, there shall be at all times at least one representative of the ETJ on the Board of Adjustment.
- B. Adjustment of Ratio of Town and ETJ Members: Within six months of the publication of the decennial census information for the Town of Boone and Watauga County, conducted by the United States Census Bureau, the Administrator shall inform the Town Council of any change in the ratio of Town population to ETJ population which requires a modification in the number of Town and ETJ members. Thereafter, as positions open by resignation, removal for cause or absence, or expiration of term, the number of members shall be adjusted through the appointment process to achieve the required balance between Town and ETJ members. An ETJ position shall be created or the number of ETJ positions reduced on the Board of Adjustment when the population of the entire ETJ constitutes a full fraction of the Town's population divided by the total membership of the Board of Adjustment or when the population of the ETJ falls below a full fraction of the Town's population divided by the total membership of the Board of Adjustment, respectively.

- C. Appointment of Members to the Board of Adjustment
 - Town Appointments: All Town members of the Board of Adjustment shall be appointed by the Town Council following the procedures of Section 35.01 of the Municipal Code.
 - a. Qualifications: The Council shall select appointees only from those who apply for the position and are otherwise qualified. A qualified person is one who lives in the Town, who expresses a willingness to familiarize herself with the Town's UDO, Comprehensive Plan and all other duly adopted plans and Ordinances relating to the regulation of development within the Town planning jurisdiction, who agrees to apply in good faith the Town's Unified Development Ordinance and Comprehensive Plan, and who expresses a willingness to serve on the Board of Adjustment.
 - 2. ETJ Appointments: When an ETJ member vacancy exists as the result of the expiration of a term, resignation, or because a new area is brought into the ETJ and the increased population requires that a new ETJ member be appointed, the following procedures shall be followed:
 - a. Council Town Procedure: When an ETJ member vacancy exists as the result of the expiration of a term, resignation, or because a new area is brought into the ETJ and the increased population requires that a new ETJ member be appointed, the following procedures shall be followed:
 - i. By January 15 of each calendar year, the Town Clerk shall forward to the County Clerk a list of the current members of the Board, designating the ETJ members and the expiration date of their terms.
 - ii. When a vacancy occurs in an ETJ position prior to the end of a term or due to increased population which requires that a new ETJ member be appointed, the Town Clerk will notify the County Clerk, in writing, of the vacancy or position, including, as applicable, the name of the person who has vacated the position and the date the vacancy is effective, with vacancies which have already occurred at the time of the notification labeled "immediate."
 - iii. At least sixty (60) days before a vacancy occurs due to the expiration of a term; or in the case of a vacancy prior to the end of a term, at the next meeting of the Council after the Town Clerk becomes aware of the vacancy; the Town Clerk shall inform the Town Council of the vacancy. The Council will announce the vacancy at the meeting at which it is so informed by the Town Clerk and solicit applications for

the vacancy. The Town Clerk shall promptly post notice of the vacancy on the Town's website.

- At its next regular meeting after it has announced a vacancy, whether iv. it is due to the expiration of a term, a vacancy prior to the end of a term, or increased population which requires that a new ETJ member be appointed, the Town Council shall adopt a resolution requesting that the Watauga County Board of Commissions appoint a qualified person as a member to the position and it shall direct the Town Clerk to forward the resolution to the County Clerk, along with the names of such persons who have applied through the Town for the position and who the Council recommend for appointment. Prior to adopting the resolution, when it pertains to positions created by vacancy due to the expiration of a term or resignation of a member, the Town Council may itself solicit applications for the position, and it may transmit its two top choices for each position to the Board of Commissioners. If, after a protracted time, the Council has received a single application or no applications, it may nevertheless request that the Board of Commissioners proceed with an appointment.
- v. If the Board of County Commissioners fails to make an appointment within ninety (90) days after receiving a resolution from the Town Council requesting that it be made, the Council may make the appointment, but the person appointed shall reside in the ETJ and be otherwise qualified.

b. Board of Commissioners Procedure:

- i. The Board of Commissioners shall have ninety (90) days after the County Clerk receives the Town Council's resolution requesting the Board of Commissioners to appoint a person to fill an ETJ member vacancy. If it does not make an appointment within that time, the power of appointment shall revert to the Council.
- ii. The Board of Commissioners shall only appoint a person to the Board to fill a term which has expired on or after date of expiration and only after it had received the resolution from the Council requesting the appointment.
- iii. The Board of Commissioners shall only appoint a person to fill a vacancy that occurs prior to the end of a term or which has been created due to increased population which requires that a new ETJ member be appointed after thirty days have elapsed from the receipt by the County Clerk of the Council's resolution requesting the appointment.

- iv. Before making an appointment, the Board of Commissioners shall announce the vacancy at a regularly-scheduled meeting and solicit applications for the position, and the County Clerk shall post notice of the vacancy on the Watauga County Website.

- vi. The Board of Commissioners shall consider the choices directed to it person(s) recommended by the Council for the position. However, before appointing a new person to the Board of Adjustment, the Watauga County Board of Commissioners must hold a public hearing on the selection.

- A. Notice: Notice of the hearing shall be given once a week for two successive calendar weeks in a newspaper having general circulation in the area.

 - 1. Number of Town Members: Five (5) regular members of the Board of Adjustment and five (5) alternates shall reside within the Town (hereafter, "resident members").
 - 2. Number of ETJ Members: Three (3) regular members and three (3) alternates shall reside within the Town's ETJ. Should the Town's ETJ be expanded or the ratio of the population of the ETJ relative to the population of the Town increase or decrease, in accordance with N. C. Gen. Stat. §160A-362 and as specified herein, the Town will adjust the number of members from the ETJ in order to maintain proportional representation based on population for residents of the ETJ relative to the Town. However, the resident members may never number fewer than five (5) regular members and five (5) alternates, so if necessary to maintain proportionality, the full size of the Board shall be increased. So long as the Town exercises extraterritorial jurisdiction, there shall be at all times at least one representative of the ETJ on the Board of Adjustment.
- B. Adjustment of Ratio of Town and ETJ Members: Within six months of the publication of the decennial census information for the Town of Boone and Watauga County, conducted by the United States Census Bureau, the Administrator shall inform the Town Council of any change in the ratio of Town population to ETJ population which requires a modification in the number of Town and ETJ members. Thereafter, as positions open by resignation, removal for cause or absence, or expiration of term, the number of members shall be adjusted through the appointment process to achieve the required balance between Town and ETJ members. An ETJ position shall be created or the number of ETJ positions reduced on the Board of Adjustment when the population of the entire ETJ constitutes a full fraction of the Town's population divided by the total membership of the Board of Adjustment or when the population of the ETJ falls below a full fraction of the Town's population divided by the total membership of the Board of Adjustment, respectively.

- C. Appointment of Members to the Board of Adjustment
 - Town Appointments: All Town members of the Board of Adjustment shall be appointed by the Town Council following the procedures of Section 35.01 of the Municipal Code.
 - a. Qualifications: The Council shall select appointees only from those who apply for the position and are otherwise qualified. A qualified person is one who lives in the Town, who expresses a willingness to familiarize herself with the Town's UDO, Comprehensive Plan and all other duly adopted plans and Ordinances relating to the regulation of development within the Town planning jurisdiction, who agrees to apply in good faith the Town's Unified Development Ordinance and Comprehensive Plan, and who expresses a willingness to serve on the Board of Adjustment.
 - 2. ETJ Appointments: When an ETJ member vacancy exists as the result of the expiration of a term, resignation, or because a new area is brought into the ETJ and the increased population requires that a new ETJ member be appointed, the following procedures shall be followed:
 - a. Gouncil Town Procedure: When an ETJ member vacancy exists as the result of the expiration of a term, resignation, or because a new area is brought into the ETJ and the increased population requires that a new ETJ member be appointed, the following procedures shall be followed:
 - i. By January 15 of each calendar year, the Town Clerk shall forward to the County Clerk a list of the current members of the Board, designating the ETJ members and the expiration date of their terms.
 - ii. When a vacancy occurs in an ETJ position prior to the end of a term or due to increased population which requires that a new ETJ member be appointed, the Town Clerk will notify the County Clerk, in writing, of the vacancy or position, including, as applicable, the name of the person who has vacated the position and the date the vacancy is effective, with vacancies which have already occurred at the time of the notification labeled "immediate."
 - iii. At least sixty (60) days before a vacancy occurs due to the expiration of a term; or in the case of a vacancy prior to the end of a term, at the next meeting of the Council after the Town Clerk becomes aware of the vacancy; the Town Clerk shall inform the Town Council of the vacancy. The Council will announce the vacancy at the meeting at which it is so informed by the Town Clerk and solicit applications for

the vacancy. The Town Clerk shall promptly post notice of the vacancy on the Town's website.

At its next regular meeting after it has announced a vacancy, whether it is due to the expiration of a term, a vacancy prior to the end of a term, or increased population which requires that a new ETJ member be appointed, the **Fown** Council shall adopt a resolution requesting that the Watauga County Board of Commissions appoint a qualified person as a member to the position and it shall direct the Town Clerk to forward the resolution to the County Clerk, along with the names of such persons who have applied through the Town for the position and who the Council recommend for appointment. Prior to adopting the resolution, when it pertains to positions created by vacancy due to the expiration of a term or resignation of a member, the Town Council may itself solicit applications for the position, and it may transmit its two top choices for each position to the Board of Commissioners. The Board of Commissioners shall have ninety (90) days after the County Clerk receives the Town Council's resolution requesting the Board of Commissioners to appoint a person to fill an ETJ member vacancy. If it does not make an appointment within that time, the power of appointment shall revert to the Council.
- ii. The Board of Commissioners shall only appoint a person to the Board to fill a term which has expired on or after date of expiration and only after it had received the resolution from the Council requesting the appointment.
- The Board of Commissioners shall only appoint a person to fill a vacancy that occurs prior to the end of a term or which has been created due to increased population which requires that a new ETJ member be appointed after thirty days have elapsed from the receipt by the County Clerk of the Council's resolution requesting the appointment.



If, despite good faith efforts, enough qualified residents of the ETJ cannot be found to fill the seats reserved for residents of such area, then the Watauga County Board of Commissioners may appoint other residents of the county who are otherwise qualified, including residents of the Town, to fill these seats.
 - B. The Commissioners shall make the appointment within forty-five days following the public hearing. Planning Commission

2.02.01 Appointment and Terms of Planning Commission Members

- A. Number of Members: There shall be a Planning Commission consisting of thirteen (13) members.
 - Number of Town Members: Eight (8) members of the Planning Commission shall reside within the Town. To the extent a qualified person can be found, one of the Town members shall be a resident of Boone and a full-time student of Appalachian State University.
 - 2. Number of ETJ Members: Five (5) members shall reside within the Town's extraterritorial planning area (hereafter "ETJ"). Should the Town's ETJ be expanded or the ratio of the population of the ETJ relative to the population of the Town increase or decrease, in accordance with N. C. Gen. Stat. §160A-362 and as specified herein, the Town will adjust the number of members from the ETJ in order to maintain proportional representation based on population for residents of the ETJ. So long as the Town exercises extraterritorial jurisdiction, there shall be at all times at least one representative of the ETJ on the Planning Commission.



C. Appointment of Members to the Planning Commission:

- Town Appointments: All Town members of the Planning Commission shall be appointed by the Town Council following the procedures of Section 35.01 of the Municipal Code.
 - a. Qualifications: The Council shall select appointees only from those who apply for the position and are otherwise qualified. A qualified person is one who lives in the Town, who expresses a willingness to familiarize herself with the Town's UDO, Comprehensive Plan and all other duly



adopted plans and Ordinances relating to the regulation of development within the Town planning jurisdiction, and who expresses a willingness to serve on the Planning Commission.

- 2. ETJ Appointments: When an ETJ member vacancy exists as the result of the expiration of a term, resignation, or because a new area is brought into the ETJ and the increased population requires that a new ETJ member be appointed, the following procedures shall be followed:

 - At its next regular meeting after it has announced a vacancy, whether it is due to the expiration of a term, a vacancy prior to the end of a term, or increased population which requires that a new ETJ member be appointed, the Town Council shall adopt a resolution requesting that the Watauga County Board of Commissions appoint a qualified person as a member to the position and it shall direct the Town Clerk to forward the resolution to the County Clerk, along with the names of such persons who have applied through the Town for the position and who the Council recommend for appointment. Prior to adopting the resolution, when it pertains to positions created by vacancy due to the expiration of a term or resignation of a member, the Town Council may

MANAGER'S COMMENTS:

Recreation Commission

The terms of Recreation Commission members representing the Blowing Rock, Mabel, and Cove Creek elementary school districts as well as three Town of Boone representatives are set to expire in December. 
