#### WATAUGA COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TUESDAY, APRIL 1, 2014

The Watauga County Board of Commissioners held a regular meeting on Tuesday, April 1, 2014, at 8:30 A.M. in the Commissioners' Board Room of the Watauga County Administration Building, Boone, North Carolina.

Chairman Miller called the meeting to order at 8:32 A.M.

Vice-Chairman Blust opened the meeting with a prayer and Commissioner Yates led the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

Chairman Miller called for additions and/or corrections to the March 18, 2014, regular meeting and closed session minutes.

Commissioner Kennedy, seconded by Commissioner Yates, moved to approve the March 18, 2014, regular meeting minutes as presented.

VOTE: Aye-5 Nay-0

Chairman Miller stated that amendments to the closed session minutes had been presented to the Board prior to the meeting.

Commissioner Kennedy, seconded by Commissioner Welch, moved to approve the March 18, 2014, closed session minutes as amended.

VOTE: Aye-5 Nay-0

#### APPROVAL OF THE APRIL 1, 2014, AGENDA

County Manager Geouque requested to add the following items to the agenda:

- A proposed proclamation of honor
- A request to use the Human Services Center parking lot
- A proposed Hazardous Materials Emergency Planning Grant Agreement
- Boards and Commissions

Commissioner Kennedy, seconded by Vice-Chairman Blust, moved to approve the April 1, 2014, agenda as amended.

VOTE: Aye-5 Nay-0

#### PROPOSED PROCLAMATION HONORING JIM ATKINSON

Chairman Miller presented Jim Atkinson a proclamation honoring his service with Watauga County and his leadership as the Director of the Department of Social Services upon his retirement which was effective April 1, 2014.

#### **COOPERATIVE EXTENSION STAFFING REQUEST**

Mr. Jim Hamilton, Cooperative Extension Director, requested authorization from the Board to use funds budgeted for the frozen horticulture agent to increase the temporary horticulture agent from twenty (20) to forty (40) hours. Currently, the County was paying nine (9) of the twenty (20) hours with the State paying the remaining eleven (11) hours. The percentage was forty-five percent (45%) County funding and fifty-five percent (55%) State funding, per the existing Memorandum of Understanding (MOU).

Mr. Hamilton proposed to increase the temporary employee's hours from twenty (20) to forty (40) hours. The County would pay twenty-nine (29) of the hours with the State continuing to pay eleven (11) hours. The request was to have the County pay seventy-two and half percent (72%) and the State twenty-seven and a half percent (27.5%) which was not in accordance with the MOU.

County Manager Geouque stated that staff reviewed the Cooperative Extension's budget to ensure adequate funding to cover benefits should the State require reimbursement for benefits. However, the potential existed for this arrangement to set a precedent in reduced funding from the State as the County was willing to fund more than the forty-five percent (45%) as stated in the MOU.

Approval of the request would run from April 2, 2014, through June 30, 2014, and would require the Board to reauthorize the request during the 2014-2015 budget process.

Commissioner Yates, seconded by Commissioner Kennedy, moved to grant the position as requested through June 30, 2014.

#### CALDWELL COMMUNITY COLLEGE & TECHNICAL INSTITUTE REQUEST

Dr. Ken Boham, President of Caldwell Community College & Technical Institute (CCC&TI), requested the Board approve a Cooperative Innovative High School Program Application for the Watauga Career Academy which would allow Caldwell Community College & Technical Institute to work with Watauga High School students, freshmen through seniors, preparing them for college and/or vocational careers upon graduation.

Commissioner Kennedy, seconded by Commissioner Welch, moved to approve the program application as presented.

VOTE: Aye-5 Nay-0

#### PROPOSED CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT FOR MIDDLE FORK GREENWAY PROJECT

Mr. Joe Furman updated the Board on the Middle Fork Greenway project. At the last Board meeting the Board selected Vaughn and Melton to provide construction administration for the Middle Fork Greenway project. Mr. Furman presented a negotiated contract for engineering with Vaughn and Melton in the amount of \$38,080.50.

Mr. Furman also solicited bids for the construction of the project. Two (2) bids were received; one from J. W. Hampton Company in the amount of \$350,616.60 and one from Greene Construction in the amount of \$392,550.24. The receipt of three (3) bids was not required due to the cost being below the statutory formal bid limit.

Grant funds were available for both construction and engineering in the amount of \$375,000. Mr. Furman stated that High Country Pathways (HCP) had committed to provide any amount above the \$375,000 grant that was needed to complete the project. The current shortfall was \$13,697.10. Mr. John Laman, President of HCP, reiterated Mr. Furman's statement that HCP would fund any amount over the grant award of \$375,000 for the project.

Commissioner Kennedy, seconded by Commissioner Welch, moved to award the construction project to the low bidder, J. W. Hampton Company, in the amount of \$350,616.60 contingent upon the County Attorney drafting a contract including that the amount of \$350,616.60 was all inclusive and costs would not exceed that amount.

Commissioner Kennedy, seconded by Commissioner Welch, moved to approve the contract with Vaughn and Melton for engineering and construction administration in the amount of \$38,080.50.

VOTE: Aye-5 Nay-0 Commissioner Yates, seconded by Commissioner Welch, moved to accept High Country Pathways' offer to fund any amount in excess of the \$375,000 grant funding for the project and to direct the County Attorney to work with High Country Pathways to draft an agreement that covers the County's interest.

## A. Discussion Regarding Proposed Amendments to the Town of Boone's Unified Development Ordinance (UDO)

County Manager Geouque presented proposed revised language for the Town of Boone Unified Development Ordinance (UDO) provisions for extra-territorial jurisdiction (ETJ) appointments. The Town Attorney advised the County Attorney that the language was tentatively acceptable to the Town Council, but the Council wanted to confirm that the language was acceptable to the Commissioners prior to taking action.

Commissioner Yates, seconded by Commissioner Welch, moved to accept the proposed amendments to the Town of Boone's Unified Development Ordinance (UDO) as presented.

#### B. Proposed Proclamation Establishing Community Pride Week

County Manager Geouque presented a proposed proclamation declaring Monday, May 12 – Saturday, May 17, 2014, as Community Pride Week in Watauga County. The event was conducted each year by Sanitation staff and has proved to be very popular with the County's citizens.

Commissioner Kennedy, seconded by Commissioner Welch, moved to adopt the proclamation as presented.

#### C. 347 Oak Street Property Sale

County Manager Geouque stated that County-owned property located at 347 Oak Street, Boone NC was advertised for sale on GovDeals in which the closing date was March 25, 2014. The final bid on the property was \$150,001 which did not meet the \$300,000 reserve set by the Board. During the foreclosure process the County used fifty percent (50%) of the value of the property (\$185,600) to loan to New River Mental Health. The difference in the bid minus the 7.5% commission (\$11,250.08) to be paid to GovDeals, should the Board accept the bid, and the loan amount was \$46,849.08.

County Manager Geouque stated that the Board could reject all bids; accept the bid and proceed with the sale of the property; or use the \$150,001 as the base bid and start the bid process over.

The County Attorney stated that the Board could also reject the bid and negotiate directly with the person who submitted the bid through GovDeals.

Mr. Tyler Conner, the high bidder through GovDeals, was present and stated that he could not bid against himself as he had not yet had an opportunity to view the property.

The tax value listed for the property totaled \$371,000; \$201,300 for the land and \$169,700 for the building.

Commissioner Yates, seconded by Commissioner Welch, moved to reject the high bid through GovDeals in the amount of \$150,001.

VOTE: Aye-5 Nay-0

After discussion, Commissioner Welch, seconded by Commissioner Yates, moved to relist the property on GovDeals beginning the bids at \$210,000.

#### D. Request to Use Human Services Parking Lot

County Manager Geouque stated that Mr. Bill Mast, father of fallen Deputy, William R. Mast, Jr., had requested the use of the Watauga County Human Services Center parking lot for the Annual William Mast Memorial Motorcycle Ride on September 13, 2014, from 7:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M. with a rain date of September 20, 2014. The dates do not conflict with ASU home football games.

Vice-Chairman Blust, seconded by Commissioner Kennedy, moved to approve the request as presented.

# A RESOLUTION BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF BOONE, NORTH CAROLINA, URGING THE WATAUGA COUNTY COMMISSION TO CHANGE THE METHOD OF DISTRIBUTION OF SALES TAX IN WATAUGA COUNTY

WHEREAS, for the last several years, whenever the Watauga County Commission has disagreed with an action taken by Boone, certain of its members have threatened to reapportion county sales taxes to the disadvantage and significant harm of the citizens of Boone; and

WHEREAS, in early 2013, Watauga County Commission members voted to change the sales tax distribution method to ad valorem from per capita, creating a net loss of revenue to the Town of Boone and Watauga County, while dramatically increasing distribution of sales tax revenues to Beech Mountain, Blowing Rock, and Seven Devils; and

WHEREAS, Watauga County has divided the portion of sales tax collected in the county based on the population or per capita distribution that has been in effect for decades; and

WHEREAS, as indicated in fiscal year 2005-2006, the Town of Boone has historically collected approximately 60% of total county sales tax revenues, yet a mere 12% percentage share of sales tax distribution was returned to the Town of Boone in fiscal year 2013-2014 using the ad valorem method; and

WHEREAS, during fiscal year 2013-2014 budget development, the Boone Town Council worked diligently to prioritize the many needs of Town residents, being forced to delay capital needs, delay facility maintenance, and make many other difficult budget decisions, ultimately doing so without an increase in the property tax rate; and

WHEREAS, in fiscal year 2013-2014, the Town of Boone budget was significantly impacted by the County Commission decision to switch distribution of sales tax to an ad valorem method, calculating sales tax distribution based on property values, which resulted in a loss of over 1.7 million dollars, or roughly 17 percent of general fund revenues; and

WHEREAS, if the Town of Boone does not offset the loss with new taxes, there will have to be many projects discontinued, including long needed capital improvement projects, and further expansion of the popular Greenway, among others; and

WHEREAS, if the Town of Boone continues to see this lost sales tax revenue without new taxes, town personnel, most of whom are residents of the county, may have to be laid off, resulting in possible reductions in police and fire protection, street maintenance, snow removal, and sidewalk maintenance and expansion; and

WHEREAS, if the Town of Boone does not offset the continued revenue loss with new taxes, funding for critical agencies in our community like the Hunger and Health Coalition and Western Youth Network, along with funding for cultural resources, such as assistance to Horn in the West, the Appalachian Regional Library, and cultural activities at the Jones House, can no longer be considered; and

WHEREAS, under State law, Boone is entitled to self-government and zoning authority, has always tried to exercise that authority for the good of the community at large rather than for the benefit of selected individuals, and has never tried to interfere with the operations of the County, instead working cooperatively with the Commissioners by supporting their recreation programs in multiple ways, leasing town-owned property to the county for nominal rent, paying the county to collect its taxes, providing water to county residents with contaminated wells, and deliberating with the County Commissioners on regional transportation plans, ETJ appointment procedures, support for our law enforcement and emergency services and many other matters; and

WHEREAS, the current County Commissioners have made many pronouncements about their opposition to increased taxes on citizens of the county, and the Town Council, too, has held the line on tax increases for more than a decade, and would appreciate not being forced to raise property taxes on Boone residents, each of whom are also Watauga County taxpayers and voters;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Council of the Town of Boone, North Carolina, hereby urges the Watauga County Commission to exercise their authority during the month of April to change the method of sales tax distribution in Watauga County back to per capita, more accurately reflecting the percentage of total sales tax collections from the Town of Boone business community.

# A RESOLUTION BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF SEVEN DEVILS NORTH CAROLINA URGING THE WATAUGA COUNTY COMMISSION TO MAINTAIN THE AD VALOREM METHOD OF DISTRIBUTION OF SALES TAX IN WATAUGA COUNTY

WHEREAS, N.C. Gen. Stat. §105-472 provides for the allocation of sales tax between cities and counties within North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, N.C. Gen. Stat. §105-472(b) allows a Board of County Commissioners to determine, on a yearly basis, whether such allocation is made on a per capita distribution or an ad valorem distribution; and

WHEREAS, the ad valorem method of sales tax distribution recognizes the value of property is distributed equitably throughout Watauga County; and

WHEREAS, in early 2013, Watauga County Commission members voted to change the sales tax distribution method to ad valorem from per capita, to be a realized revenue benefit for three of its four municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Seven Devils appreciates its good working relationship with Watauga County and the ability of the Town and County to address issues within the community to the mutual benefit of the citizens of both the Town of Seven Devils and Watauga County; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Seven Devils is willing to continue to assist Watauga County in addressing its financial needs with sales tax revenue should the ad valorem method be used in determining sales tax distribution for the fiscal year of 2014 - 2015; and

WHEREAS, a mutually financially beneficial relationship was established for the fiscal year of 2013 – 2014 between the Town of Seven Devils and Watauga County; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Seven Devils would like to continue this shared prosperity for the fiscal year 2014 – 2015 providing for, as part of its budgetary process, an amount equal to sixty percent (60 percent) of the increase in gross revenues accruing to the Town over and above the amount which would have otherwise been realized under the per capita method, to costs and expenditures as requested by Watauga County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Council of the Town of Seven Devils, North Carolina, hereby urges the Watauga County Commission to exercise their authority during the month of April to maintain the ad valorem method of sales tax distribution in Watauga County.

NOTE: Per NCGS 105-472, sales tax distribution is based on tax levies reported annually to NCDOR for prior year taxes. These numbers are real property numbers only and do not include personal property or motor vehicles.

#### § 105-472. Disposition and distribution of taxes collected.

(a) County Allocation. - The Secretary shall, on a monthly basis, allocate to each taxing county for which the Secretary collects the tax the net proceeds of the tax collected in that county under this Article. For the purpose of this section, "net proceeds" means the gross proceeds of the tax collected in each county under this Article less taxes refunded, the cost to the State of collecting and administering the tax in the county as determined by the Secretary, and other deductions that may be charged to the county. If the Secretary collects local sales or use taxes in a month and the taxes cannot be identified as being attributable to a particular taxing county, the Secretary shall allocate the taxes among the taxing counties in proportion to the amount of taxes collected in each county under this Article during that month and shall include them in the monthly distribution. Amounts collected by electronic funds transfer payments are included in the distribution for the month in which the return that applies to the payment is received.

(b) Distribution Between Counties and Cities. - The Secretary shall divide the amount allocated to each taxing county among the county and its municipalities in accordance with the method determined by the county. The board of county commissioners shall, by resolution, choose one of the following methods of distribution:

- (1) Per Capita Method. The net proceeds of the tax collected in a taxing county shall be distributed to that county and to the municipalities in the county on a per capita basis according to the total population of the taxing county, plus the total population of the municipalities in the county. In the case of a municipality located in more than one county, only that part of its population living in the taxing county is considered its "total population". In order to make the distribution, the Secretary shall determine a per capita figure by dividing the amount allocated to each taxing county by the total population of that county plus the total population of all municipalities in the county. The Secretary shall then multiply this per capita figure by the population of the taxing county and by the population of each municipality in the county; each respective product shall be the amount to be distributed to the county and to each municipality in the county. To determine the population of each county and each municipality, the Secretary shall use the most recent annual estimate of population certified by the State Budget Officer.
- Ad Valorem Method. The net proceeds of the tax collected in a taxing county (2)shall be distributed to that county and the municipalities in the county in proportion to the total amount of ad valorem taxes levied by each on property having a tax situs in the taxing county during the fiscal year next preceding the distribution. For purposes of this section, the amount of the ad valorem taxes levied by a county or municipality includes ad valorem taxes levied by the county or municipality in behalf of a taxing district and collected by the county or municipality. In addition, the amount of taxes levied by a county includes ad valorem taxes levied by a merged school administrative unit described in G.S. 115C-513 in the part of the unit located in the county. In computing the amount of tax proceeds to be distributed to each county and municipality, the amount of any ad valorem taxes levied but not substantially collected shall be ignored. Each county and municipality receiving a distribution of the proceeds of the tax levied under this Article shall in turn immediately share the proceeds with each district in behalf of which the county or municipality levied ad valorem taxes in the proportion that the district levy bears to the total levy of the county or municipality. Any county or municipality that fails to provide the Department of Revenue with information concerning ad valorem taxes levied by it adequate to permit a timely determination of its appropriate share of tax proceeds collected under this Article may be

excluded by the Secretary from each monthly distribution with respect to which the information was not provided in a timely manner, and those tax proceeds shall then be distributed only to the remaining counties or municipalities, as appropriate. For the purpose of computing the distribution of the tax under this subsection to any county and the municipalities located in the county for any month with respect to which the property valuation of a public service company is the subject of an appeal and the Department of Revenue is restrained by law from certifying the valuation to the county and the municipalities in the county, the Department shall use the last property valuation of the public service company that has been certified.

The board of county commissioners in each taxing county shall, by resolution adopted during the month of April of each year, determine which of the two foregoing methods of distribution shall be in effect in the county during the next succeeding fiscal year. In order for the resolution to be effective, a certified copy of it must be delivered to the Secretary in Raleigh within 15 calendar days after its adoption. If the board fails to adopt a resolution choosing a method of distribution not then in effect in the county, or if a certified copy of the resolution is not timely delivered to the Secretary, the method of distribution then in effect in the county shall continue in effect for the following fiscal year. The method of distribution in effect on the first of July of each fiscal year shall apply to every distribution made during that fiscal year.

- (c) Municipality Defined. As used in this Article, the term "municipality" means "city" as defined in G.S. 153A-1.
- (d) No municipality may receive any funds under this section if it was incorporated with an effective date of on or after January 1, 2000, and is disqualified from receiving funds under G.S. 136-41.2. No municipality may receive any funds under this section, incorporated with an effective date on or after January 1, 2000, unless a majority of the mileage of its streets are open to the public. The previous sentence becomes effective with respect to distribution of funds on or after July 1, 1999. # <u>HIGH COUNTRY RURAL PLANNING ORGANIZATION TRANSPORTATION</u> <u>PRIORITIES</u>

#### **MANAGER'S COMMENTS:**

Mr. Joe Furman, Planning and Inspections Director, will present the Transportation priorities for the High Country Rural Planning Organization. The General Assembly adopted a new funding method for transportation projects last year which requires that projects from all modes of transportation be ranked together. Mr. Furman compiled all modes into one list for easier viewing and ranking. In addition, he contacted the four (4) municipalities and Appalcart for input. The Town of Boone will submit one (1) project directly to the RPO; the other municipalities do not have allotted projects, so their input comes through the County. Boone is likely to choose an "in-town" project, such as the King Street/College Street improvements. Seven Devils favors the NC Highway 105 bridge/turn lane at Broadstone Road. Beech Mountain's top project is the Beech Mountain Parkway Walkway (shown as an Avery County project). Blowing Rock favors the King/College Street improvements, US Highway 421/321/194 North to Vilas widening and US Highway 321/NC Highway 105 intersection improvements in that order. Appalcart would like to purchase an additional bus if proposed student housing occurs. Documentation is attached on the input received.

The County must choose four (4) projects in priority order for submission to the RPO by April 22nd. There is no set method for how the priorities are to be established. The last time the Commissioners submitted priorities to the RPO, in April, 2011; the three (3) submitted at that time were 1) widening US Highway 421/321/194 N from 105 Bypass to Vilas; 2) widening 105 Bypass; 3) widening NC Highway 194 from King Street to Howard's Creek Road. This past fall, the Commissioners were interested in the Bamboo Road/Wilson Ridge Road improvements, which are combined into one project. The Board may also wish to consider the new Boone Bypass (Daniel Boone Parkway) which is proposed in the recently adopted Comprehensive Transportation Plan.

Board action is requested in selecting four (4) projects to be submitted to the RPO by April 22, 2014.

**SUBJECT:** High Country RPO – Call for Priority TIP Projects

**DATE:** March 19, 2014

The High Country RPO has developed a methodology for scoring and ranking transportation projects that cover all modes of transportation (highway, bicycle & pedestrian, transit, airport, and rail) for the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). As a result, the number of projects to be scored and ranked will need to be narrowed down in an effort to maximize allocated points for scoring fewer projects thus enabling the reduced number of projects to better compete for available funding. 
