SHERIFF'S OFFICE VEHICLE BID AWARD REQUEST

Captain Kelly Redmon presented the following vehicle prices for six (6) new Ford All-Wheel Drive Police Interceptor SUVs:

The low bid from Ashe County Ford for the All-Wheel Drive Police Interceptor SUV is \$25,754.93 at a cost of \$154,529.58 for the six vehicles. The total amount, including \$4,671.89 for taxes and tags, is \$159,201.47.

In addition, DANA Safety Supply of Greensboro has agreed to honor last year's price for equipment and installation at \$4,096.27 per vehicle for a total cost of \$20,481.35. The detention vehicle will not require any equipment. Adequate funds are budgeted to cover the cost of the vehicles and equipment and installation.

REQUEST TO ACCEPT GRANT AWARD FROM THE NC AGRICULTURE DEVELOPMENT AND FARMLAND PRESERVATION TRUST FUND PROGRAM

Mr. Brian Chatham stated that the Soil and Water Conservation Office recently received an award letter in the amount of \$25,000 which was \$11,300 less than requested in the application approved by the Board at the December 17, 2013, meeting.

At that December meeting, the Soil and Water and Cooperative Extension Offices requested and were granted authorization from the Board to apply for a \$36,300 grant from the North Carolina Agricultural Trust Fund. The grant required a fifteen percent (15%) match in cash or in-kind services. The request was to appropriate \$3,000 from the remaining multiflora rose program. This would have left approximately \$4,562 unspent in the multiflora rose program funds.

Cooperative Extension Director, Mr. Jim Hamilton, then proposed that \$3,000 of the match be in cash and the remaining \$2,445 be in-kind services from Cooperative Extension and Soil and Water salaries. The new recommendation is to utilize the \$3,000 in cash from the multiflora rose program and reduce the in-kind match from \$2,445 to \$750 for a total grant match of \$3,750.

Commissioner Kennedy, seconded by Commissioner Yates, moved to accept the grant from the North Carolina Agricultural Trust Fund in the amount of \$25,000 with \$3,750 match to include \$3,000 in cash from the multiflora rose program and \$750 in-kind services from Cooperative Extension and Soil and Water salaries.

Scheduling the hearing for the first meeting in October will give AppalCart additional time in submitting the grant which is due October 24, 2014.

<u>Request of Support by the Appalachian Regional Library System and</u> <u>Watauga County Library</u>

Ms. Jane Blackburn, Appalachian Regional Library Director, requested the Watauga County Board of Commissioners consider including language regarding the public library in its formulation of legislative goals to be presented to the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners (NCACC) this fall. The request includes the state to fulfill its obligation of supporting public libraries by restoring funding for State Aid to Public Libraries and to preserve the integrity of the existing distribution formula.

Commissioner Kennedy, seconded by Commissioner Welch, moved to submit the request to be included in the NCACC's Legislative Goals priorities and to continue to discuss and consider additional priorities as presented.

PUBLIC HEARING TO ALLOW CITIZEN COMMENT REGARDING PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE ORDINANCE TO GOVERN THE HEIGHT OF STRUCTURES IN WATAUGA COUNTY

Chairman Miller stated that a public hearing has been scheduled to allow citizen comment regarding proposed amendments to the Ordinance to Govern the Height of Structures in Watauga County.

Commissioner Kennedy, seconded by Commissioner Yates, moved to call the public hearing to order at 6:12 P.M.

Mr. Joe Furman stated that the purpose of the amendment was to simplify the method used to determine building height and, at the same time, provide the applicant the option to use the more complicated method found in the NC Building and Residential Codes. The 40 foot height limitation would remain unchanged.

As there was no citizen comment, Chairman Miller declared the public hearing closed at 6:17 P.M.

Commissioner Yates, seconded by Commissioner Welch, moved to adopt the Amendments to the Ordinance to Govern the Height of Structures in Watauga County as presented.

MIDDLE FORK GREENWAY PROJECT CHANGE ORDER REQUEST

Mr. Joe Furman stated that at the April 1, 2014, Board meeting, J.W. Hampton Company was awarded the bid for the Middle Fork Greenway project in the amount of \$350,616.60. During the construction process it was discovered that a fifteen (15) inch storm drain empties into the box culvert that was to be converted into the greenway. The North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) will not allow the storm drain to empty into the box culvert and therefore a change order in the amount of \$19,911.15 is requested. Mr. Furman was able to negotiate an additional \$25,000 from NCDOT to cover the cost. The new total cost of the project would be \$400,000.

Commissioner Kennedy, seconded by Commissioner Welch, moved to accept the \$19,911.15 change order from J.W. Hampton Company to reroute the fifteen (15) inch storm drain, and to approve the attached supplemental agreement between the County and the North Carolina Department of Transportation for the additional \$25,000.

SANITATION MATTERS

A. Bid Award Request for Brush Grinding Services

Mr. J.V. Potter, Operations Service Director, presented the following bids received for brush grinding:

Mr. Potter recommended approval of the low bid with Superior Mulch in the amount of \$18.24 per ton for brush grinding. Adequate funds were budgeted to cover the contract expense.

Commissioner Yates, seconded by Commissioner Welch, moved to approve the contract with Superior Mulch for the grinding of brush at a rate of \$18.24 per ton for Fiscal Year 2014-2015.

B. Clarification Regarding Contract for Transfer Station Floor Repairs

Mr. Potter stated that the Board approved a contract for repairs on the transfer station floor at the August 5, 2014, Board meeting. Staff provided information on the warranty of the product to be used in the repair to be five (5) years. However, upon execution of the contract it was discovered that the warranty on the product was for a one (1) year period. Upon review, all of the products offered for repair carried a one (1) year warranty including the existing floor of the transfer station. However, based on research with current customers the products have lasted over five (5) years or more, thus the confusion from staff.

Mr. J.V. Potter, Operations Service Director, is still recommending Industrial Supply Solutions the lowest responsive bidder in the amount of \$88,825. The proposal would repair approximately 9,500 square feet of floor space. The replacement of the floor was discussed during the budget process and adequate funds are available for the expense.

Commissioner Yates, seconded by Commissioner Welch, moved to proceed with Industrial Supply Solutions in the amount of \$88,825 for repairs to the transfer station floor with the one (1) year warranty.

PROJECT ON AGING MATTERS

A. Allocation Request of FY 2015 Home & Community Care Block Grant (H&CCBG) Funds

Project on Aging Director, Ms. Angie Boitnotte, presented the allocation of \$251,376 in Home and Community Care Block Grant (H&CCBG) funds for FY 2015. The required local match was \$27,931 and was present in the Project on Aging's FY 2015 budget. This is a \$4,687 reduction from the original allocation of \$256,063.

Commissioner Kennedy, seconded by Commissioner Welch, moved to approve the Home and Community Care Block grant allocations as recommended by the Home & Community Care Block Grant Committee.

B. Senior's Health Insurance Information Program (SHIIP) Grant/Contract Acceptance Request

Ms. Angie Boitnotte, Director of Project on Aging (POA), requested the Board accept the FY 2015 grant/contract for the Senior's Health Insurance Information Program (SHIIP). The grant is in the amount of \$3,051 and requires no County funds. The funds are used to provide assistance and outreach to low-income citizens.

Commissioner Kennedy, seconded by Commissioner Welch, moved to accept the Senior Health Insurance Information Program grant as presented by Ms. Boitnotte.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS PLANNING GRANT APPLICATION REQUEST

Mr. Jeff Virginia, Emergency Services Director, requested the Board authorize the submittal of a Hazardous Materials Planning Grant. The proposed exercise scenario would involve a gasoline tanker overturning at the curve at the Elk Motel and spilling the contents into the New River.

The proposed exercise will include Watauga County Fire Departments, North Carolina Highway Patrol, Watauga County Sheriff's Office, Boone Police Department, Watauga Medical Center, Watauga Medics, Watauga County EMS, public health, and water departments of Boone, Blowing Rock, and ASU.

Commissioner Yates, seconded by Commissioner Welch, moved to authorize the submission of the application for the Hazardous Materials Planning Grant as presented.

TAX MATTERS

A. Monthly Collections Report

Tax Administrator Larry Warren presented the Tax Collections Report for the month of August 2014. This report was presented for information only and, therefore, no action was required.

MISCELLANEOUS ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

A. Oak Street Property Sale Update

County Manager Geouque stated that the Board accepted a proposed Purchase and Sales Contract presented by Mr. John Winkler for County-owned property located at 347 Oak Street in the amount of \$160,000 on August 28, 2014.

The upset bid period closed September 10, 2014, with no upset bids received. Therefore, the Board may take action to reject the bid; direct staff to continue advertising the property as is or utilize GovDeals and pay a 7.5% commission if a bid is accepted; or accept Mr. Winkler's proposal in the amount of \$160,000 with a 180 day investigation period which would begin upon acceptance of the bid.

Commissioner Welch, seconded by Commissioner Yates, moved to accept the offer from Mr. John Winkler to purchase the County-owned property located at 347 Oak Street in the amount of \$160,000 with a 180 day investigation period.

B. Sheriff's Office Equipment and Licensing Contract

County Manager Geouque stated that the Sheriff's Office had requested approval of contracts with MSAB, Inc. in the amount of \$13,015 for equipment, software, and training that will allow

the retrieval of information from cellphones. The equipment is \$8,010 and the software is \$2,495 minus a \$490 discount for a total of \$10,015. Training for the equipment is \$3,000 with an additional \$564.32 travel expenses. Recurring costs will be approximately \$4,490 which covers licensing and software updates. Since this is an unbudgeted item, a budget amendment will be forthcoming to include a fund balance appropriation from the federal drug funds for the first year cost of \$13,579.32.

Commissioner Yates, seconded by Commissioner Welch, moved to approve the contracts with MSAB for \$10,015 for equipment, software, and freight and \$3,000 for training and \$564.32 for travel expenses for a total amount \$13,579.32.

Valle Crucis Historic Preservation Committee

Appalachian Regional Library Board

- * These awards are to be given to a Register of Deeds that has gone "above and beyond the call of duty". This would be a Register that is NOT serving as an officer. It could be a committee/district chair or an NCARD Member who works hard on behalf of the Association.
- * May also be given to a Register that has retired since the last conference.
- * 2 awards will be given each year.
- * May be given to a Register only one time.
- * Must have the following criteria: Must have 5 years of service Must be a Certified Register of Deeds

Each year around the same time as the ballot for the Eunice Ayers Award goes out – the Special Recognition Committee Chair would send to the District Chairs the Shining Star Award Form. Each District would send in one nomination to the Chair of the SP/A Com. And the committee will choose the winners.

Employed in the Register of Deeds office in January 1983 and was elected Register of Deeds in November, 2004. Completed the Advanced Register of Deeds certification in 2007, serves as NCARD District II secretary/treasurer, and serves as vice-chair of the NCARD Election Committee and on the Special Recognition Committee. She has served on the Strategic Long Range Planning Committee, Finance Committee and Certification Committee. She served on the Mortgage Assignment Task Force formed in 2011 to determine the advisability of requiring assignments to be recorded. She helped coordinate the North Carolina Association of Registers of Deeds annual conference held in Watauga County in 1995 and 2003. 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AGENDA ITEM 5:

BOARD OF EDUCATION'S REQUEST FOR LOTTERY AND ADM FUNDS

MANAGER'S COMMENTS:

Ms. Ly Marze, Finance Director for Watauga County Schools, will request funds from the Education Lottery Fund. \$240,750 will be used to upgrade electrical service available at schools due to increased demand/need, \$40,000 for upgrading lighting in gyms for energy conservation and improved lighting with LEDs, \$72,000 for partial roof replacement at Parkway School, \$10,000 for installation of a new drop ceiling at Blowing Rock School to provide better acoustics, \$40,000 for continued replacement of old carpet and floor tiles at Mabel, Valle Crucis, Green Valley, and Hardin Park Schools, and \$15,000 for cafeteria upgrades at Cove Creek and Blowing Rock Schools.

Ms. Marze will also request \$300,000 in ADM funds for district wide technology to update wireless access points, phone system upgrades, and projector replacements in all schools.

The total amount requested is \$717,750.

Board action is required to approve and disburse the requested funding.



The Project on Aging received notification that each of the County's two senior centers are eligible to receive Senior Center General Purpose funding in the amount of \$15,573 on a reimbursement basis through an appropriation from the NC General Assembly and the Division of Aging. The L. E. Harrill Senior Center, as a Center of Excellence, is eligible to receive \$11,680, which requires a 25% local match of \$3,893. The Western Watauga Community Center is eligible to receive \$3,893, which requires a 25% local match of \$1,298. The required match is present in the agency's FY15 budget.

These funds can be used to support and develop programming and general operations including salaries, supplies, equipment, capital outlay, and other operating costs. We plan to use the funds to expand classes at both centers, as well as other various ongoing expenses.

I. Parties to the Contract:

This Contract, made and entered into this 18th day of September by and between <u>Watauga County Project on Aging</u>, hereinafter referred to as "Contractor" and the High Country Council of Governments, Area Agency on Aging hereinafter referred to as the "Agency". This Contract shall insure to the benefit of and be binding upon the parties hereto, their successors and legal representatives.

II. Effective Period:

This Contract period is effective July 1, 2014 and terminates on June 30, 2015, with the option to extend if mutually agreed, through a written amendment as provided for in Part XI.

III. Independent Status:

The parties hereto acknowledge that they are independent entities. Neither party shall represent itself as agent or employee of the other, nor shall either party bind or represent that it has the ability to bind the other to any monetary or legal obligation. The parties hereto acknowledge that neither this nor any provision hereof shall be deemed to create a partnership or joint venture between the parties.

Each party hereto agrees to be responsible for its own liabilities and that of its officers, employees, agents, or representatives arising out of this Contract including fiscal responsibility for deviations from this Contract.

V. Administrators for the Contract:

The persons named below shall be administrators for the respective parties and shall be the persons to whom notices provided for in this Contract shall be given and to whom matters relating to administration or interpretation of this Contract shall be addressed. Either party may change its administrator or his address or his telephone number by written notice to the other party.

VI. General Provisions:

- A. The place of this Contract, controlling its status and form, shall be Watauga County, North Carolina, and all matters relating to the validity, construction, interpretation, and enforcement of this Contract shall be determined in the courts of Watauga County. Any Suit in federal district court relating to this Contract shall be brought in the United States District Court, Western District of North Carolina.
- B. This Contract supersedes all prior agreements between the parties and expresses their entire understanding with respect to the transactions contemplated herein. Any prior agreements, verbal understandings or otherwise, shall be deemed merged herein. In witness whereof, the Contractor and the Agency have executed this

Agreement in duplicate originals, one of which is retained by each of the parties.

VII. Responsibilities of the Agency:

Make payment to the Contractor as described in Section IX of this Contract.

VIII. Responsibilities of the Contractor:

- A. The Contractor shall expend the award in keeping with the attached description indicating how funding will be utilized. Funding will not be disbursed until this description is received by the Agency.
- B. The Contractor is to use or expend state funds only for the purposes for which they were appropriated by the General Assembly. If the Contractor is a governmental entity, such entity is subject to the provisions of the requirements of OMB Circular A-133 and the NC Single Audit Implementations Act of 1987. Furthermore, contractor will comply with reporting requirements as defined by the G.S. 146-6.2 (see Attachment A).
- C. Submitting any other plans, reports, documents or other products that the Agency may specify.
- D. Complying with Title VI and VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) and all requirements imposed by Federal regulations, rules and guidelines issued pursuant to these Titles for both personnel employed and clients served.
- E. None of the work to be performed under this contract which involves the specialized skill or expertise of the Contractor shall be subcontracted without prior approval of the Agency's contract administor.
- F. The disclosure of information concerning services, applicants or recipients obtained in connection with the performance of this contract is prohibited. The use of such information is restricted to the performance of the Contractor's responsibilities specified in this contract.
- G. The Contractor expressly states that he presently has no interest and shall not acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of services

required to be performed under this contract. The Contractor shall not employ any person having such interest during the performance of this contract. The Contractor further agrees to notify the Agency in writing of any instance that might have the appearance of a conflict of interest. Upon execution of this contract and prior to disbursement of funds, the Contractor shall submit to the Agency a notarized copy of the Contractor's policy addressing conflict of interest in accordance with G.S. 143-6.1 Section 13.

IX. Payment for Services:

Payment to the contractor will be conducted in the following manner:

- A. The High Country Council of Governments will pay the contractor \$15,573. State funds will not exceed 75% of total expenditures. The total match requirement is \$5,191. Total funding, including minimum local match is \$20,764.
- B. The High Country Council of Governments will reimburse the contractor for expenditures. Reimbursement will be made when the senior center expenditure information is entered into the ARMS. As with all other non-unit reimbursement funding, the contractor is to send invoices or other backup documentation to the AAA monthly or as expenditures are incurred and entered into ARMS. This funding is to be coded as Senior Center general purpose funds, service code 176, fund source code 7.
- C. Because funding is provided on a reimbursement basis, all requests for reimbursement must be submitted to the AAA by May 31, 2015.
- D. It is understood and agreed between the Contractor and the Agency that the payment of compensation specified in this agreement, its continuation or any renewal or extension thereof, is dependent upon and subject to the allocation or appropriation of funds to the Agency for the purpose set forth in this agreement.

X. Copyrights and Distribution of Materials:

The Contractor may copyright materials originated in the performance of this contract. These copyrights not withstanding, the Agency may use, disclose, duplicate and distribute all materials delivered under this Contract. The Contractor hereby grants to the Agency a royalty-free, non-exclusive and irrevocable license to publish, translate, reproduce, deliver, perform, dispose

of, and to authorize others so to do, all data, reports, publications, studies, curricula or other materials originated in the performance of this Contract. Such license shall be only to the extent that the Contractor has the right to grant such license. The Contractor may not market the products of this Contract for profit.

XI. Amendment:

This Contract may be modified by written amendment at any time. From time to time, changes in the scope of the services of the Contractor to be performed under this agreement are required. Such changes, including but not limited to any renewal of extension, that increase or decrease the amount of the Contractor's compensation, which are mutually agreed upon by and between the Contractor and the Agency shall be incorporated in written amendments to this contract and signed by both parties.

XII. Termination:

This Contract may be canceled in whole or in part at any time:

- A. By either party, immediately for cause, upon written notice to the other party delivered by registered mail with return receipt requested, or in person;
- By either party, upon at least thirty days notice in writing to the other party delivered by registered mail with return receipt requested, or in person; or
- C. By mutual consent of both parties. After receipt of a notice of termination, and except as otherwise directed by the Agency, the Contractor shall cease work under the Contract on the date, and to the extent specified, in the notice of termination. In the event of termination in part, both parties shall continue the performance of this Contract to the extent not terminated. If the Contract is terminated as provided herein, the Contractor will be paid for services actually delivered through the termination date.

XIII. Default:

WHEREAS, the state-funded, formula-based Rural Operating Assistance Program (ROAP) administered by the North Carolina Department of Transportation, Public Transportation Division provides funding for the operating cost of passenger trips for counties within the state;

WHEREAS, the county uses the most recent transportation plans (i.e. CTSP, CTIP, LCP) available and other public involvement strategies to learn about the transportation needs of agencies and individuals in the county before determining the sub-allocation of these ROAP funds;

WHEREAS, the county government or regional public transportation authorities created pursuant to Article 25 or Article 26 of Chapter 160A of the General Statutes (upon written agreement with the municipalities or counties served) are the only eligible recipients of Rural Operating Assistance Program funds which are allocated to the counties based on a formula as described in the Program Guidelines included in the ROAP State Management Plan. NCDOT will disburse the ROAP funds only to counties and eligible transportation authorities and not to any sub-recipients selected by the county;

WHEREAS, the county finance officer will be considered the county official accountable for the administration of the Rural Operating Assistance Program in the county, unless otherwise designated by the Board of County Commissioners;

WHEREAS, the passenger trips provided with ROAP funds must be accessible to individuals with disabilities and be provided without discrimination on the basis of national origin, creed, age, race or gender (FTA C 4702.1A, FTA C 4704.1, Americans with Disabilities Act 1990); and

MANAGER'S COMMENTS:

The Golden Leaf Foundation is accepting Letters of Inquiry for potential funding for the Northwest Prosperity Zone which consists of Alexander, Alleghany, Ashe, Avery, Burke, Caldwell, Catawba, McDowell, Mitchell, Watauga, Wilkes, and Yancey counties. Each county may submit up to three (3) projects totaling no more than \$1.5 million. A Letter of Inquiry must be endorsed by the County Manager in order for the project to be considered.

Caldwell Community College and Technical Institute (CCC&TI) and Appalachian Regional Healthcare System, Inc. (ARHS) have submitted Letters of Inquires. CCC&TI is requesting \$500,000 to create the Watauga Culinary Lab. The lab will offer training in culinary arts and hospitality management designed to develop a more versatile workforce with applied technical skills needed for employment in food service and hospitality industries. The estimated cost of the lab is \$600,000. ARHS submitted two (2) Letters of Inquiries in the event the County received less than three (3) projects or requested amounts were less than the \$1.5 million maximum. This being the case, ARHS is requesting \$1 million in funding to build the Chestnut Ridge post-acute facility. The estimated cost of the facility is \$28,873,335.

Board action is requested to approve and authorize the County Manager to sign Caldwell Community College and Technical Institute and Appalachian Regional Healthcare System, Inc. Letters of Inquiries in the amount of \$500,000 and \$1 million, respectively.

With support from the Boone and Blowing Rock Chambers of Commerce, the High Country Workforce Development Board, and Watauga Campus CCCTI Advisory Board, CCCTI will develop a culinary arts associate degree program in Watauga County. This initiative will offer training in culinary arts and hospitality management designed to develop a more versatile workforce with applied technical skills needed for employment in food service and hospitality industries. By addressing local industry-specific job training needs, this project will provide continuity and progression from Watauga High School's highly successful ProStart foods program to post-secondary degree programs and employment. CCCTI has already committed significant resources toward this project, but funding from Golden LEAF will allow CCCTI to purchase additional equipment and renovate underutilized space on the Watauga campus enabling the college to meet increasing workforce demands for highly trained culinary/hospitality workers.

Appalachian Regional Healthcare System (ARHS) is building a state of the art, 112 bed, medical facility dedicated to providing post-acute care services to residents and visitors of the High Country of North Carolina. Construction on the site began in July 2014, and is expected to take 24 months. ARHS' primary service area consists of Watauga, Ashe and Avery counties. Chestnut Ridge will allow ARHS to provide high quality, post-acute care services tailored primarily for our region's aging population, while also improving healthcare delivery at our two acute care hospitals, Watauga Medical Center and Charles A. Cannon, Jr. Memorial Hospital. Aside from the improvements to healthcare in the region, Chestnut Ridge will save 110 jobs from the facility that it will replace, Blowing Rock Hospital. The new facility is expected to create 59 new jobs. In the longer term, ARHS seeks to co-locate a retirement community on the remaining land.

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The total project budget is \$28,873,335. The Chestnut Ridge at Blowing Rock project has been broken down into three budget categories: facility construction, land acquisition and infrastructure needs.

Facility construction is expected to cost \$20,480,889. Appalachian Regional Healthcare Foundation (ARHF), ARHS' fundraising arm, has begun a capital campaign to raise \$10,000,000 in private support for this project. As of September 1, 2014, ARHF, has raised approximately \$6,500,000.

Facility construction is expected to cost \$20,480,889. Appalachian Regional Healthcare Foundation (ARHF), ARHS' fundraising arm, has begun a capital campaign to raise \$10,000,000 in private support for this project. As of September 1, 2014, ARHF, has raised approximately \$6,500,000.

ARHS acquired two parcels of land for this project for \$4,450,000. On March 1, 2011, ARHS purchased approximately 44 acres of land for \$2,950,000. ARHS purchased an additional 24 acres on May 4, 2012 for \$1,500,000. ARHS paid cash for both purchases.

Infrastructure costs are expected to be \$3,942,446. Infrastructure needs include a road and bridge at \$2,583,330 and water and sewer at \$1,359,116.
