# WATAUGA COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS JOINT MEETING WITH THE WATAUGA COUNTY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION MONDAY, OCTOBER 8, 2012

The Watauga County Board of Commissioners held a joint meeting with the Watauga County Economic Development Commission (EDC) at 4:30 P.M. on Monday, October 8, 2012, in the Commissioners' Board Room at the Watauga County Administration Building, Boone, North Carolina.

Those present were: Chairman Miller, Vice-Chairman Gable, Commissioner Blust, Commissioner Deal, County Manager Geouque, and Clerk to the Board Fogle. Others present were as follows: Economic Development Commission Members: Mr. Andy Ball, Mr. Dan Meyer, Mr. Keith Honeycutt, Mr. Charles Hardin, Ms. Mary Hall, Mr. Paul Combs, Ms. Lauren Waterworth, Ms. Jeannine Underdown Collins, Mr. Ben Shoemake, and Mr. Tommy Sofield. Staff: Mr. Joe Furman, Planning and Inspections and Economic Development Director and Mr. John Spears, Planner.

Chairman Miller called the joint meeting to order at 4:37 P.M. and turned the meeting over to EDC Chairman, Keith Honeycutt.

Mr. Honeycutt stated that the Economic Development Commission had an aggressive but proactive plan to attract industrial development to Watauga County. At the Board of Commissioners' August 21, 2012, regular meeting the EDC had requested the use of the County-owned, old high school property for the location of an Industrial Park. Mr. Honeycutt stated that the EDC funds were available for due diligence and surveying the property. The consulting firm InSite, owned by Tonya Crist and Rob Cornwell, was hired by the EDC to perform a targeted marketing analysis. InSite had shared a list of approximately 150 businesses to contact once an Industrial Park was established

The Board of Commissioners received two offers to purchase the old high school property at their October 2, 2012, regular meeting. One was in the amount of \$15,000,000 and the other \$15,500,000. Neither offer was in compliance with the General Statutes nor at an amount that the Board was willing to accept; however, new offers could be submitted at a future meeting. Both offers proposed mixed use development including retail and housing.

The EDC's recommendation for a "Class A" industrial park at the old high school property was based upon the readiness of the property which already contained the infrastructure sought by many industries. The property was owned by the County, contained 25 flat usable acres, and had the following already available: a roadway, water/sewer, gas lines, power, and high speed internet. These amenities would have to be constructed and installed if another property was purchased for the Park.

Other properties were mentioned; however, Mr. Honeycutt stated that all 150 companies whose names had been provided to the EDC by InSite indicated that they wanted to be located within a "Class A" Industrial Park as opposed to a stand-alone site. The InSite study also identified the following markets for a "Class A" Industrial Park:

## **Primary Markets**

- Watauga County's existing companies
- entrepreneurs/creative class
- professional, scientific and technical services including computer systems design services

#### **Future Markets**

- miscellaneous manufacturing, including sporting and athletic goods manufacturing
- surgical and medical instruments
- surgical appliances and supplies
- computer and electronic manufacturing, including analytical laboratory instrument manufacturing
- professional, scientific and technical services, including research and development in biotechnology.

Mr. Honeycutt stated that there were other potential sites; however, the EDC had focused on the old high school property upon InSite's recommendation.

After discussion, Mr. Honeycutt stated that he understood the Board of Commissioners was in favor of the concept of a "Class A" industrial Park and encouraged the Economic Development Commission to move forward with the search for an appropriate site of which a potential purchase could be considered at a time when the old high school property was sold.

Chairman Miller thanked the Economic Development Commission for its work on this project.

Mr. Dan Meyer announced that a "Meet the Candidates" event would be held the evening of Tuesday, October 9, 2012, at the Watauga County Courthouse.

Chairman Miller adjourned the meeting at 5:37 P.M.

## WATAUGA COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS SPECIAL MEETING – INTERGOVERNMENTAL RETREAT THURSDAY, OCTOBER 11, 2012

The Watauga County Board of Commissioners attended a special meeting on Thursday, October 11, 2012, in the 5<sup>th</sup> Floor Lobby of the Appalachian Athletic Center on the campus of Appalachian State University, Boone, NC. The Intergovernmental Retreat agenda included presentations focused on Local Government Finance, the Watauga County Comprehensive Transportation Plan, and Coordinated Dispatch Services. Mr. Phil Trew, High Country Council of Governments, called the joint meeting to order at 5:14 P.M. by welcoming everyone and calling for introductions.

After dinner was served, Mr. Trew introduced Mr. Craig Hughes, Transportation Planner with the High Country Council of Governments, who discussed the process involved with development of the Watauga County Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP). The main points of Mr. Hughes' presentation included the following:

## **Watauga County Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP)**

- The last Thoroughfare Plan for Watauga County was completed in 2002 and the last Thoroughfare Plan for Boone was completed in 1991
- CTP developed by NCDOT and RPO staff, under guidance of Steering Committee
- Steering Committee members included:

- CTP makes recommendations for all modes of transportation
- Recommendations are based on Traffic Counts, Population & Employment projections, the plan's goals and objectives (which were approved by all local governing boards), and local planning documents
- They are long range (30 year) plans
- It is a vision plan and no funding is attached
- The CTP does not finalize any new locations. It can reflect the preference of an alignment by the local governments, but all alternatives will still need to be considered as a project goes through the planning and permitting process.
- Projects in a mutually adopted CTP are easier to justify for inclusion in the State Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)
- The plan will be available for public comment until November 13<sup>th</sup>
- A survey has been made available to collect public comments at <u>www.surveymonkey.com/s/WataugaCountyCTPRec</u>
- A public workshop will be held on November 8<sup>th</sup> from 4-6 at the High Country Council of Governments to allow additional public input.
- The final draft will be forwarded to the local governing boards for consideration.

Mr. Trew then introduced Mr. Cooper Sellers with the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) who reviewed the following recommendations from the Draft CTP:

## Watauga County Intergovernmental Retreat CTP Project Recommendations

## <u>HIGHWAY</u>

## US 321-421: TIP# R-2615 (Proposed US 421 Bypass to Vilas)

US 321-421 is currently over capacity and is projected to remain over capacity in 2040 from the proposed US 421 BYP to US 321 in Vilas. The purpose of this project is to relieve congestion on the existing facility and to accommodate projected traffic volumes in order to maintain a Level of Service (LOS) D on the facility.

US 321-421 is the primary route between Boone and the western portions of the county. It is currently a two lane facility with a speed limit of 55 miles per hour (mph). Lane widths vary from

11 to 12 feet. The facility is currently over capacity with an Average Annual Daily Traffic (AADT) volume of 15,200 vehicles per day (vpd), compared to a LOS D capacity of 12,100 vpd. Approximately 19,500 vpd are projected in 2040.

The CTP proposes improving this section of US 321-421 to a boulevard. This would be accomplished by widening to four lanes, adding a median, and 4 foot paved shoulders to accommodate bicycles.

## US 321 (Blowing Rock Rd/Hardin St)

US 321 is projected to be near or over capacity in 2040 from US 421 (King Street) to the proposed US 421 BYP. The purpose of this project is to accommodate projected traffic volumes in order to maintain a Level of Service (LOS) D on the facility.

Existing US 321 from US 421 (King Street) in Boone to Fairway Drive (SR 1602) has four 12 foot wide thru lanes, a speed limit of 35 mph, and a center turn lane. From Fairway Drive (SR 1602) to the proposed US 421 BYP, US 321 changes to a 4 lane undivided cross section. The 2010 Average Annual Daily Traffic (AADT) volume ranges from 18,000 vehicles per day (vpd) north of NC 105 to 41,800 vpd south of NC 105, compared to a LOS D capacity of 25,400 vpd and 26,600 vpd respectfully. Approximately 24,000 to 61,700 vpd are projected in 2040.

The CTP proposes converting US 321 to a boulevard by removing the center turn lane, providing a median, and bicycle accommodations.

## NC 105 Bypass

NC 105 BYP (SR 1107) is projected to be near or over capacity in 2040 from NC 105 to Caldwell Community College. The purpose of this project is to accommodate projected traffic volumes in order to maintain a Level of Service (LOS) D on the facility.

Justification of Need NC 105 BYP (SR 1107) from NC 105 to US 321-421 has two 12 foot lanes and a speed limit of 55 miles per hour (mph). The 2010 Annual Average Daily Traffic (AADT) volume ranges from 10,600 to 13,500 vpd, and has a capacity of 13,500 vpd (LOS D). The estimated 2040 traffic volume ranges from 10,200 to 16,000 vpd.

The CTP proposes improving NC 105 BYP (SR 1107) to a boulevard. This would be accomplished by widening to four lanes, adding a median, and 4 foot paved shoulders to accommodate bicycles.

## NC 194 (US 421 to Howards Creek Road)

NC 194 is currently near or over capacity and is projected to be over capacity in 2040 from US 221-421 to Howards Creek Road (SR 1306). The purpose of this project is to accommodate projected traffic volumes in order to maintain a Level of Service (LOS) D on the facility.

Within the Boone municipal limits, NC 194 is a two lane facility with a speed limit of 35 miles per hour (mph), lane widths of 10 feet, an Average Annual Daily Traffic (AADT) volume of 10,500 vehicles per day (vpd) and a capacity (LOS D) of 9,400 vpd. Outside the Boone municipal limits, NC 194 is a two lane facility with a speed limit of 55 mph, lane widths of 9 feet, an AADT volume of 8,600 vpd and a capacity (LOS D) of 12,200 vpd. NC 194 is the primary route between Boone and the northern portions of the county. Approximately 12,800 vpd are projected in 2040.

The CTP proposes improving this section of NC 194 to a boulevard. This would be accomplished by widening to four lanes and adding a median. Additionally, bicycle and pedestrian accommodations are recommended along the proposed project.

## US 221. TIP No. R-2915 (Deep Gap to NC 88 in Jefferson)

US 221 from US 321 in Deep Gap to NC 88 in Ashe County is projected to be over or near capacity in the Ashe County section. The 2012 – 2018 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) includes project R-2915 that is intended to address this deficiency.

The TIP project includes widening US 221 to a four lane boulevard with bicycle accommodations. This project is currently scheduled for construction in 2015 according to the 2012-2018 TIP.

## US 321, TIP No. R-5016 (Vilas to Tennessee)

US 321 from Avery County to US 421 in Vilas does not meet future mobility needs. This facility is intended to provide mobility in Watauga County and, ultimately, connectivity between Johnson City, TN and Gastonia, NC. Additionally, US 321 from US 421 in Vilas to Rominger Road (SR 1121) is projected to be near capacity by 2040.

US 321 from Avery County to US 421 in Vilas is recommended to be upgraded to an expressway (4 lanes with median) with bicycle accommodations. As development occurs along this corridor every effort should be made to limit access in order to maintain mobility.

## US 321 (Proposed US 421 Bypass to Blowing Rock)

US 321 from the proposed US 421 BYP south of Boone to US 221 north of Blowing Rock does not meet future mobility needs. This facility is intended to provide mobility in Watauga County and, ultimately, connectivity between Johnson City, TN and Gastonia, NC. Additionally, a portion of this facility between the proposed US 421 BYP and Niley Cook Road (SR 1532) will be near capacity by 2040.

This section of US 321 is recommended to be upgraded to an expressway (4 lanes with median). As development occurs along this corridor every effort should be made to limit access in order to maintain mobility and connectivity.

#### US 321. TIP No. R-2237

US 321 from US 221 north of Blowing Rock to Caldwell County does not meet the future mobility needs in western North Carolina and into Tennessee. This facility is intended to provide mobility in Watauga County and, ultimately, connectivity between Johnson City, TN and Gastonia, NC. The 2012 – 2018 TIP includes project R-2237 that will address this problem.

## **US 421 Bypass, TIP No. U-2703**

Currently, US 421, US 321, and NC 105 in Boone experience congestion. This is a result of the mix of through traffic trying to connect between NC 105 to the southwest and US 421 to the east and heavy traffic to destinations downtown (King Street) and along US 321, TIP project U-2703, the proposed US 421 Bypass, is intended to address this deficiency.

The proposed project includes constructing a bypass south of Boone. The proposed bypass is recommended to be constructed as a freeway (4 lanes with median).

## US 421. (West of Boone)

US 421 from US 321 in Vilas to Tennessee is projected to be near or over capacity by 2040. Improvements are needed to accommodate projected traffic volumes in order to maintain a LOS D on the facility.

The CTP Committee also recommended and intends to pursue the inclusion of US 421 from US 321 in Vilas to Tennessee as a boulevard on NCDOT's SHC Vision Plan. The CTP proposes widening US 421 to a four lane boulevard with bicycle accommodations from US 321 in Vilas to Tennessee.

## US 421, (East of Boone)

US 421 from the end of the existing divided section east of Old US 421 (SR 1416) to NC 194 is projected to be over capacity by 2040. Improvements are needed to accommodate projected traffic volumes in order to maintain a LOS D on the facility.

The CTP proposes improving US 421 to a boulevard (4 lanes with median) from NC 194 to Old 421 (SR 1416) and to an expressway from Old 421 (SR 1416) to the end of the existing divided section by removing the center turn lane and providing a median.

## NC 105. (Current 4 lane section)

NC 105 from NC 105 BYP (SR 1107) to US 221-421 is currently over capacity. Improvements are needed to relieve existing congestion and to accommodate projected traffic volumes in order to maintain a LOS D on the facility.

The CTP proposes improving this section of NC 105 to a boulevard (4 lanes w/median) by removing the center turn lane, providing a median, and bicycle accommodations.

#### NC 105. TIP No. R-2566 (Boone to Avery County)

NC 105 from NC 105 BYP (SR 1107) to Avery County is projected to be over capacity by 2040. TIP project R-2566 is intended to address this deficiency.

#### Bamboo Road

Bamboo Road (SR 1514) from Wilson Ridge Road (SR 1523) to US 221-421 is currently over capacity. Improvements are needed to relieve existing congestion and to accommodate projected traffic volumes in order to maintain a LOS D on the facility.

The CTP proposes widening Bamboo Road (SR 1514) to 12 foot lanes with 4 foot paved shoulders to accommodate bicycles. Additionally, intersection improvements are recommended at Wilson Ridge Road (SR 1523).

#### **Deerfield Road**

Deerfield Road (SR 1522) from State Farm Road to Bamboo Road (SR 1514) is currently over capacity. Improvements are needed to relieve existing congestion and to accommodate projected traffic volumes in order to maintain a LOS D on the facility.

The CTP proposes widening Deerfield Road (SR 1522) to 12 foot lanes with 4 foot paved shoulders to accommodate bicycles from State Farm Road to Bamboo Road (SR 1514). Additionally, intersection improvements are recommended at Wilson Ridge Road (SR 1523).

## Wilson Ridge Road

Wilson Ridge Road (SR 1523) from Deerfield Road (SR 1522) to Bamboo Road (SR 1514) is projected to be near capacity by 2040. Improvements are needed to accommodate projected traffic volumes in order to maintain a LOS D on the facility.

The CTP proposes widening Wilson Ridge Road (SR 1523) to 12 foot lanes with 4 foot paved shoulders to accommodate bicycles. Additionally, intersection improvements are recommended at Deerfield Road (SR 1522) and Bamboo Road (SR 1514).

## Presnell School Road (SR 1125) Extension

The only access point to Beech Mountain from the Watauga County side is via US 321. An alternative access route between Beech Mountain and US 321 is desired for emergency purposes.

The CTP proposes extending Presnell School Road (SR 1125) to Cherry Gap Road in Beech Mountain. This new location facility would be 2 lanes and have 4 foot paved shoulders. The proposed new location would attempt to utilize an existing local road bed.

#### **Bodenheimer Drive**

By request of the Town of Boone, Division 11 has begun an investigation into a new location facility connecting Homespun Hills Road (SR 1148) and Bodenheimer Drive west of Appalachian State University (ASU). This would require a minimum of 200 feet of new location to connect the two facilities. Making this connection will open up a new tertiary access point between ASU and NC 105.

#### **Seven Devils Road**

An alternative access route between Seven Devils and the surrounding network is desired for emergency purposes.

The CTP proposes building a new facility between Seven Devils Road (SR 1151) and NC 105. This new facility would be 2 lanes with 4 foot paved shoulders.

#### **State Farm Road**

State Farm Road from NC 105 to Deerfield Road (SR 1522) is projected to be over capacity by 2040. Improvements are needed to accommodate projected traffic volumes in order to maintain a LOS D on the facility.

The CTP proposes improving State Farm Road to a three lane cross section with 4 foot paved shoulders to accommodate bicycles.

### **MINOR WIDENING IMPROVEMENTS**

The following facilities within Watauga County do not have capacity issues, but were identified as candidates for upgrading to NCDOT design standards. Implementation of the proposed projects should be coordinated through NCDOT's Highway Division 11 office.

**WATA0012-H:** NC 194 from Howards Creek Road (SR 1306) to Castle Ford Road (SR 1333) – Widen to 12 foot lanes with 4 foot paved shoulders to accommodate bicycles.

**WATA0013-H:** Bamboo Road (SR 1514) from Deerfield Road (SR 1523) to Friendship Church Road (SR 1525) – Widen to 12- foot lanes with 4- foot paved shoulders to accommodate bicycles.

**WATA0014-H:** Broadstone Road (SR 1112) from NC 194 to NC 105 – Widen to 12 foot lanes with 4 foot paved shoulders to accommodate bicycles.

WATA0015-H: Greenway Road from Wilson Drive to Leola Drive – Widen to 12 foot lanes.

WATA0016-H: Meadowview Road from US 221-321 to US 221-321 – Widen to 12 foot lanes.

WATA0017-H: Leola Drive from Greenway Road to US 321 - Widen to 12 foot lanes.

WATA0018-H: Poplar Grove Road (SR 1102) from Rivers Street (SR 1163) to NC

105 – Widen to 12 foot lanes.

WATA0019-H: Rivers Street (SR 1163) from Poplar Grove Road (SR 1102) to US

321 (Hardin Street) - Widen to 12 foot lanes.

#### **Unaddressed Deficiencies**

The following deficiencies were identified during the development of the CTP, but they remain unaddressed.

- US 321-421 (King Street) from US 321 (Hardin Street) to Hodges Gap Road (SR1104) in
  downtown Boone is currently over capacity. Because of physical constraints, no method of
  improvement was found to be acceptable to Boone at this time. Central business district
  storefront development prevents any additions to the current pavement width. While the existing
  pavement width would be sufficient to provide four travel lanes, Boone prefers to keep the
  existing arrangement of two 12 foot travel lanes and roadside parking.
- US 321 BUS from US 221 to Globe Road (SR 1537) in downtown Blowing Rock is projected to
  be over capacity by 2040. Because of physical constraints, no method of improvement was
  found to be acceptable to Blowing Rock at this time. Central business district storefront
  development prevents any additions to the current pavement width. While the existing pavement
  width would be sufficient to provide four travel lanes, Blowing Rock prefers to keep the existing
  arrangement of two 12 foot travel lanes and roadside parking.
- A small section of Deerfield Road (SR 1522) is projected to be over capacity by 2040. This
  section begins at the intersection with State Farm Road, and extends 250 feet to the northeast.
  The primary cause of this congestion is the reduced capacity resulting from a 25 mph speed
  limit around Watauga County Hospital. At this time, locals prefer to maintain the speed limit
  zone.

### **PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION**

AppalCART currently operates fixed bus routes in the county. Out of county services are provided by the Mountaineer Express. During the development of the CTP, one new route was identified as a strategic new expansion for AppalCART.

A new bus route is recommended between Boone and Blowing Rock utilizing US 321. Additionally, seven locations were identified for potential park and ride lots. They are proposed at the following intersections:

- 1. US 221 and US 321 in Blowing Rock
- 2. US 221-421 and Brookshire Road (SR 1328)
- 3. US 321 and US 421 in Vilas
- 4. US 321-421 and NC 105 BYP (SR 1107)
- 5. US 421 and Old US 421 in Rutherwood
- 6. US 421 and US 221 in Deep Gap
- 7. NC 105 and Shulls Mill Road (SR 1557) in Foscoe

Out of county services provided by the Mountaineer Express connect Boone with the regional hubs of Charlotte, and Greensboro. Both the East/West and the North/South routes are projected to need additional service capacity by 2040.

## **BICYCLE**

In accordance with American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO), roadways identified as bicycle routes should incorporate the following standards as roadway improvements are made and funding is available:

- Curb and gutter sections require at minimum 4 foot bike lanes or 14 foot outside lanes.
- Shoulder sections require a minimum 4 foot paved shoulder.
- All bridges along roadways where bike facilities are recommended shall be equipped with 54 inch railings.

#### **Multi-Use Path Facilities:**

Multi use paths are facilities physically separated from motor vehicle traffic that is either within the highway right-of-way or on an independent right-of-way. Multi-use paths include bicycle paths, rail-trails, or other facilities built for bicycle and pedestrian traffic. Multi-use paths from the Boone pedestrian plan, Walk Boone 2011, were incorporated into the CTP Boone. Additionally, the following multi-use path project was identified to serve the needs of Watauga County.

#### Middle Fork Greenway

The envisioned Middle Fork Greenway would run between Boone and Blowing Rock, a distance of about 6.5 miles. The greenway would connect the existing Boone Greenway with Shoppes on the Parkway at the intersection of US 221 and US 321 in Blowing Rock. The Middle Fork River is part of the headwaters of the New River and as such is important to watershed, trout streams, and wetlands found in the vicinity. Watauga County Pathways is a non-profit organization working towards the preservation and eventual construction of this corridor.

#### **PEDESTRIAN**

Boone has an existing pedestrian plan entitled "Walk Boone 2011" that was utilized in the development of the pedestrian element of the CTP. The Walk Boone 2011 plan was cooperatively developed by Boone and NCDOT's Division of Bicycle and Pedestrian Transportation. The Town of Beech Mountain Streetscape Plan was developed in 2010. The information from these pedestrian plans was incorporated into the CTP. Additionally, pedestrian improvements are recommended in the following locations.

- 5. Ransom Street from Sunset Drive to US 321
- 6. Wallingford Road from Laurel Lane to Globe Road (SR 1537)
- 7. US 321-421 from NC 105 BYP (SR 1107) to Boone municipal limits
- 8. NC 105 BYP (SR 1107) from NC 105 to US 321-421
- 9. Poplar Grove Road (SR 1102) from NC 105 to Water Street

#### Improvement to Existing Facilities:

1. US 221 from US 321 BUS to Chetola Lake Drive

#### **New Off Road Facilities:**

- 1. from Clark Street at Old Stable Lane to US 221 at Cone Road (SR 1571) opposite the Bass Lake parking lot
  - Blake Brown recommended including improvements to the intersection of College and King Streets in Boone in the CTP

Commissioner Blust opened the meeting with a prayer and Vice-Chairman Gable led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Miller called for additions and/or corrections to the October 16, 2012, agenda.

Commissioner Deal recommended moving the public comment period regarding the recent request to rename a portion of the NC 194 Scenic Byway to the beginning of the meeting since Mr. Ralph Yates, who had made the request, needed to travel out-of-town that evening.

County Manager Geouque requested to add a bid award request for swimming pool complex skylight repairs.

Vice-Chairman Gable, seconded by Commissioner Blust, moved to approve the October 16, 2012, agenda as amended.

# PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD TO ALLOW CITIZEN COMMENT REGARDING A RECENT REQUEST TO RENAME A PORTION OF NC 194 SCENIC BYWAY IN VALLE CRUCIS IN HONOR OF MR. ED YATES

Mr. Ralph Yates presented a petition signed by several citizens in support of renaming a portion of the NC 194 Scenic Byway in Valle Crucis in honor of Ed Yates.

Chairman Miller informed those in attendance of the request which would include adopting a resolution to submit to the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) for consideration.

Chairman Miller called for any additional public comment.

There being no further comments, Chairman Miller tabled further discussion until later in the meeting to allow for another call for comments since the item had been moved to an earlier time on the agenda.

## PROPOSED PURCHASE AND SALE AGREEMENTS FOR THE OLD WATAUGA HIGH SCHOOL PROPERTY

Chairman Miller stated that the current notice of sale for the old high school property included the term that any realtor commission generated from the sale of the property would be split in half between the realtor representing the buyer whose offer was originally accepted to begin the upset bid process and the realtor representing the buyer who ultimately purchased the property. Chairman Miller stated that he preferred the realtor representing the ultimate purchaser of the property receive 100% of the realtor commission.

After discussion, Commissioner Deal, seconded by Commissioner Futrelle, moved that, in the event an offer was accepted to begin the upset bid process for the purchase of the old high school property, the realtor representing the initial offer would receive 10% of the final realtor commission and the closing realtor would receive 90% of the final realtor commission.

Vice-Chairman Gable, seconded by Commissioner Blust, moved to rescind the current Notice of Sale for the old high school property and, in the event that the old high school property sells, to award 100% of the final realtor commission to the closing realtor.

VOTE: Aye-3(Miller, Gable, Blust) Nay-2(Deal, Futrelle) Chairman Miller, seconded by Vice-Chairman Gable, moved to enter into the following agreements:

- A Disclosure and Fee Agreement for Non-Listed Property Sale, including Exhibit B and as amended with 100% of the realtor commissioner to go to the closing realtor, with Mr. Rick Miller, serving as the buyer agent for Campus Crest Development, LLC; and
- A Disclosure and Fee Agreement for Non-Listed Property Sale, including Exhibit B and as amended with 100% of the realtor commissioner to go to the closing realtor, with Mr. John L. Howie, serving as the buyer agent for Sanctuary Management, LLC; and
- A Disclosure and Fee Agreement for Non-Listed Property Sale, including Exhibit B and as amended with 100% of the realtor commissioner to go to the closing realtor, with Mr. Tim Hagaman, serving as the buyer agent for Place Acquisition, LLC.

VOTE: Aye-3(Miller, Gable, Blust) Nay-2(Deal, Futrelle)

County Attorney Eggers stated that during the upset bid process an upset bid steps into the shoes of the accepted bid so the upset bid commission would be restricted to the original amount agreed upon. The County Attorney stated all terms would be locked in at the time that an offer was accepted and the amount would be what was raised during the upset bid process. Bids could be rejected by the Board of Commissioners at anytime; however, that would result in the process having to start over.

Chairman Miller stated that two offers had been received in regards to the old high school property. One was a revised offer from Campus Crest Development, LLC, in the amount of \$17,000,000 with a one hundred eighty (180) day inspection period. The agreed upon realtor commission between Campus Crest Development, LLC, and Mr. Rick Miller was ten percent (10%). The second offer received was from Sanctuary Management, LLC, in the amount of \$16,600,000 with a one hundred fifty (150) day inspection period. The agreed upon realtor commission between Sanctuary Management, LLC, and Mr. John Howie was five percent (5%).

Mr. Andrew Young, Campus Crest Development, LLC Vice-President, gave a brief presentation regarding their plans for development of the old high school property. Mr. Young also requested time to allow Campus Crest Development, LLC, representatives to speak privately with Mr. Rick Miller to discuss the amount of Mr. Miller's realtor commission.

While Campus Crest Development, LLC, representatives stepped out of the meeting to discuss their offer, the County Manager presented the information received from Sanctuary Development, LLC, regarding their plans for development of the old high school property. County Manager Geouque asked if Sanctuary Development, LLC, would be given the same opportunity to amend their offer as Campus Crest Development, LLC?

Commissioner Deal requested that the meeting be recessed to allow time for the Commissioners to review and compare the offers presented.

Chairman Miller tabled further discussion and declared a short break while waiting for Campus Crest Development, LLC, representatives to return to the meeting.

At 6:59 P.M. Mr. Andrew Young returned to the meeting and stated that Mr. Rick Miller had agreed to accept a realtor commission of seven percent (7%).

County Attorney Eggers stated that the Sanctuary Development, LLC, offer required changes to meet statutory requirements.

Chairman Miller tabled further discussion until a later time in the meeting.

## WATAUGA COUNTY TOURISM DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY'S (TDA) FY 12 ANNUAL REPORT

Mr. Wright Tilley, Tourism Development Authority (TDA) Executive Director, updated the Board on TDA activities and presented occupancy tax reports with one showing the ending figures for Fiscal Year 2012 and another showing the figures for the first two months of the current Fiscal Year. Fiscal Year 2012 ended with an 8.05% increase over the prior fiscal year translating into an additional \$66,065.58 in occupancy tax revenue. July 2012 revenues were up 1.66% and August revenues were up 17.93% giving the TDA their best August total to date.

Mr. Tilley stated that the TDA's advertising campaign "Its Cooler Up Here" allowed promotion of not only the cooler mountain temperatures but also the "cool" things to do in the area. The NC Department of Commerce & Division of Tourism has released their county-by-county economic impact of travel report for 2011. Watauga County generated an economic impact of \$197.56 million in 2011 which was a 4.11% increase from 2010.

Mr. Tilley also reported that the TDA had recently launched a "Brand Perception and Market Study" research initiative through Magellan Strategies Group & R2R Research. Study results should provide a baseline of perceived brand and destination awareness and serve as a base for helping evaluate future marketing and advertising campaign effectiveness.

The TDA's infrastructure projects are progressing as expected. With the exception of minor landscaping projects, Watauga Gorge Park is complete. The playground at Rocky Knob Park is complete and getting a lot of use. The picnic shelter is nearing completion as well. The grants for each of these projects are expected to be closed-out by the end of October.

Mr. Tilley also shared that the TDA's 2011/2012 audit, conducted by Martin Starnes & Associates, had been accepted by the Local Government Commission.

The report was given for information only and, therefore, action was not required.

## WATAUGA COUNTY LIBRARY UPDATE

Ms. Monica Caruso, Watauga County Librarian, updated the Board regarding a Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) outreach grant which was recently awarded in the amount of \$14,479. Grant funds were being used for an outreach project for elderly citizens whose agerelated physical or visual limitations made it difficult for them to read print books. The LSTA grant will allow the Library to provide assistive technology in the form of E-Readers, along with training and support, so that elders can once again enjoy reading. The outreach project will serve facility-bound elders by lending E-readers to elder care facilities and homebound elders through collaboration with Watauga County Project on Aging. Ms. Caruso stated that Ms. Jackie Cornette, Western Watauga Branch Head Librarian and Outreach Specialist, planned to make a presentation regarding the progress of the project at the next regular Commissioners' Board meeting.

Ms. Caruso shared upcoming dates for Employability Programs held at the Library, some of which would be conducted by the Caldwell Community College Small Business Center.

Ms. Caruso invited the Board to attend a dedication ceremony for a Veterans video collection on Tuesday, November 13, 2012, at 3:00 P.M. at the Watauga County Library.

The report was given for information only and, therefore, action was not required.

## FINANCE MATTERS

## A. Smoky Mountain Center Quarterly Financial Report

Ms. Margaret Pierce, Finance Director, presented the Smoky Mountain Center Quarterly Financial Report as required by Statute.

The report was given for information only and, therefore, no action was required.

## B. Proposed Inmate Insurance Contract Renewal

Ms. Pierce presented a proposed contract renewal with Insurance Management Consultants, Inc., for catastrophic insurance for inmates housed in the County jail. The insurance shields the County from large medical claims that occur while inmates are being housed in the Watauga County Jail. A lower rate, in the amount of \$39,886 (with a \$10,000 deductible), was submitted after Board packets were prepared which lowered the original quote by \$703; however, the overall increase was \$7,157 compared to the current contract. Ms. Pierce stated that funds were available to cover the contracted cost.

Commissioner Deal, seconded by Commissioner Blust, moved to approve the contract with Insurance Management Consultants, Inc. for catastrophic insurance coverage in the amount of \$39,886.

## A. Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Application for Housing Rehabilitation through the NC Catalyst Program

Ms. Michelle Ball with High Country Council of Governments requested authorization for the County to apply for the 2012 Community Development Block Grant funds in the NC Catalyst category in the amount of \$175,000, which were competitive funds and may or may not be awarded. The CDBG funds would be used to rehabilitate houses occupied by very low-income households in Watauga County.

Ms. Ball stated that this was the second of two required public hearings for the NC Catalyst Program category and, therefore, requested authorization to submit the application.

Mr. Joe Furman, Planning and Inspections Director, reviewed the changes as proposed by the Valle Crucis Historic Preservation Commission and approved by the Watauga County Planning Board. Mr. Furman reviewed the following amendments:

#### 2.5 Performance Standards

#### e. Signage

In order to maintain the rural historic character of the District, signs must be limited in size and number. Therefore, off-premises advertising signs are prohibited. On-premises signs are limited as follows:

- a) Signs shall not be placed within a public road right-of-way.
- b) Signs located fifteen (15) feet to twenty five (25) feet from the centerline of a road shall be limited to ten (10) square feet in size.
- c) Signs located twenty five (25) to thirty five (35) feet from the centerline of a road shall be limited to twenty (20) square feet in size.
- d) Signs located thirty five (35) feet or more from the centerline of a road shall have a maximum size of thirty two (32) square feet.
- e) Each establishment is limited to a maximum of two signs (one (1) detached and one
- (1) attached). However, in a situation where a detached sign is not visible from both directions due to topography or other obstruction, two (2) detached signs may be permitted and shall have a maximum size of ten (10) square feet each.
- f) The maximum height of detached signs is ten (10) feet measured from the ground.

## **EXISTING** g) Signs shall not be lighted by either interior or exterior illumination.

PROPOSED g) Signs shall not be internally illuminated – i.e. translucent plastic signs prohibited. h) Where street or site lighting does not provide sufficient illumination, signs may be externally illuminated by low level, shielded stationary bulbs installed in compliance with North Carolina Statutes §136-32.2. Sign lighting shall be turned off at 11 pm.

#### 2.8 Certificate of Appropriateness

#### a. Required

#### **EXISTING**

No exterior portion of any building or other structure (including masonry walls, fences, light fixtures, steps and pavement or other appurtenant features) nor above ground utility structure nor any type of outdoor advertising sign shall be erected, altered, restored, moved or demolished within the Valle Crucis Historic District until after an application for a Certificate of Appropriateness as to exterior features has been submitted to and approved by the Valle Crucis Historic Preservation Commission.

#### 2.14 Compliance

Compliance with the terms of the Certificate of Appropriateness shall be enforced by the Watauga County Department of Planning and Inspections.

Failure to comply with a Certificate of Appropriateness shall be a violation of this Ordinance.

## **EXISTING**

The discontinuance of work or the lack of progress towards achieving compliance with a Certificate of Appropriateness for a period of six months shall be considered as failure to comply with a Certificate of Appropriateness. PROPOSED To ensure continued compliance with the provisions of this ordinance, each approved certificate of appropriateness shall expire 12 months from the date on which final action was taken to approve the application, unless otherwise identified in the certificate, if the alteration, construction, demolition, relocation, or removal has not been initiated. Time extensions may be granted in accordance with the Commission's Rules of Procedure Section 10.17.

Nothing contained in this Ordinance shall prohibit, impair or limit in any way the power of Watauga County to prevent the construction, reconstruction, alteration, or removal of building structures, appurtenant fixtures or outdoor signs in the Historic District in violation of the provisions of this Ordinance.

The enforcement of any remedy already provided herein shall not prevent the enforcement of any other remedy or remedies provided herein or in any other ordinances or laws. (See North Carolina General Statutes 160A-175 and 160A-389) General Statutes 160A-175 and 160A-389)

Mr. Furman also noted an additional amendment recommended at the October 15, 2012, Planning Board meeting as follows:

### e. Signage

In order to maintain the rural historic character of the District, signs must be limited in size and number. Therefore, off-premises advertising signs are prohibited.

On-premises signs are limited as follows:

h) Where street or site lighting does not provide sufficient illumination, signs may be externally illuminated by low level, shielded stationary bulbs installed in compliance with North Carolina Statutes §136-32.2. Sign lighting shall be turned off at by 11 pm.

There being no public comment, Chairman Miller closed the public hearing at 7:20 P.M.

Commissioner Deal, seconded by Commissioner Blust, moved to adopt the text amendment as presented.

Commissioner Deal, seconded by Commissioner Blust, moved to adopt the following Statement of Plan Consistency regarding the adoption of the text amendment to the Valle Crucis Historic District Ordinance:

The Board of Commissioners finds adoption of the recommended zoning text amendments to be consistent with the findings and recommendations of the Citizens' Plan for Watauga. The commissioners hereby approve and adopt the amendments as reasonable and in the public interest because:

- 1. Advertising signage is critical to the success of local merchants who rely on tourism.
- 2. Sign lighting provides guidance and informs both visitors and residents after dark.

At 7:23 P.M. Commissioner Blust, seconded by Chairman Miller, moved to excuse Vice-Chairman Gable from the meeting as he had a prior commitment to attend to.

## **AQUATIC CENTER SKYLIGHT REPAIR PROJECT**

Mr. Robert Marsh stated that the County recently requested bids to repair the skylights at the aquatic center. Six contractors expressed interest in the project; however, only three contractors submitted bids for the repair as listed below:

## A. Recommended Contract Awards for Employee Medical, Dental, and Life Insurance

County Manager Geouque stated that he had received renewal rates for employee medical, dental, and life insurance benefits. The initial renewal received by CIGNA's medical underwriting requested an increase of 36.2%. Staff requested CIGNA to further review enrollment and claim experience which resulted in a 21.55% reduction that yielded a rate of 14.65%. Prior to receiving the lower rate, staff contacted Employee Benefit Advisors (EBA), the County's current broker for dental and life insurance, and requested that they price the County's health insurance with Blue Cross Blue Shield (BCBS). The initial renewal rate from BCBS was 11.89% including all fees and commissions. Staff requested both CIGNA and BCBS to provide the best rate available to the County.

The County Manager stated that final rates submitted were 9.78% from CIGNA and 5.36% from BCBS. There was one minor difference in the plan submitted by BCBS. The difference was in the amount paid for services out-of-network related to out-of-pocket expenses. Currently, an employee pays a \$2,500 deductible for services received in-network. Once the \$2,500 in-network deductible is met, the employee is covered at 100%. However, if the employee chooses to receive services out-of-network they would then be required to pay an additional \$2,500 for a total out-of-pocket expense of \$5,000. Under the new plan the employee utilizing services in-network would pay the same \$2,500 deductible and then be fully covered. The same employee who decides to utilize services out-of-network would be required to pay an additional \$3,750 for a total out-of-pocket expense of \$6,250 or a \$1,250 difference over the current plan. The County Manager stated that the change would not necessarily be negative in that it steers employees to utilize in-network services which saves the County and employee money while stretching the employee's HSA dollars further. Blue Cross Blue Shield has stated that their network is larger than the CIGNA network and their contracts for services provide higher discounts which should reduce or potentially nullify the difference in the plans.

Selecting BCBS would require the establishment of new HSA accounts through Mellon Bank. Employees would be given the option to continue using the existing HSA account through JP Morgan Chase until all funds are spent (they would have 24 months to exhaust the funds) or employees would have the option of transferring their current balances to the new HSA account through Mellon Bank. If the Board approves staff's recommendation an email will be sent to employees outlining the changes and providing information on open enrollment and individual or small group meetings to prepare the employees for the plan change. Employees will be required to complete a physical (\$500) and health assessment (\$500) in order to receive the \$1,000 HSA contribution. This is a change from last year in that employees were given \$500 with no requirements and \$250 for a physical and \$250 for a health assessment.

Ms. Tenia Friday-Taylor with CIGNA was present and made an additional offer of a 4.78% increase with no benefit changes. Mr. Cooley Smith with Blue Cross/Blue Shield (BCBS) stated that BCBS stood by their final and best offer which also included a larger network of contracted doctors and hospitals.

Commissioner Deal stated that if the Board did not honor the bid process then the County could potentially see large increases next year due to a lack of bids.

County Manager Geouque stated that he had requested "best and final" offers prior to the meeting and presented the quotes as received.

The County is currently in the second year of a two year rate lock for dental insurance and the second year of a three year rate lock for life insurance with Lincoln Financial Group. Both dental and life insurance bids were solicited with no offers received that were competitive with existing rates.

The County Manager stated that adequate funds were budgeted to cover the proposed renewal rates.

Commissioner Deal, seconded by Commissioner Futrelle, moved to:

- award the bid for employee health insurance to Blue Cross Blue Shield through Employee Benefit Advisors (EBA) as presented; and
- approve the County funding \$1,000 into each employee's HSA account as presented; and
- approve continuing with Lincoln Financial Group as the County's provider for dental and life insurance.

#### B. Proposed SECU ATM Lease Renewal

County Manager Geouque stated that the State Employees Credit Union had requested to renew the lease for their ATM located in the Human Services Center parking lot. The current lease is scheduled to expire on December 31, 2012. The proposal increases the monthly amount from \$385 to \$400 with a five (5) year term. No other changes were made compared to the current agreement. The County Manager reported that the State Employees Credit Union had been a good steward of the property.

Commissioner Futrelle, seconded by Commissioner Deal, moved to approve the lease agreement renewal for a five (5) year term in the amount of \$400 a month contingent upon the County Attorney's review.

## C. Proposed AT&T Cell Lease

County Manager Geouque stated that the Board had previously considered leasing a co-location site at Rocky Knob Park (on an existing Blue Ridge Electric Membership Company (BREMCO) transmission pole) to AT&T for a cell tower antenna. As grant monies partially funded the land acquisition for the park property, Parks and Recreation Trust Fund (PARTF) permission for the

location of the cell tower was required and granted. In addition, Board approval was granted based on the stipulation that funds generated from the lease were to be used for park maintenance and repairs. At that time an "Intent to Lease Notice" was advertised as directed by the County Attorney and required by the North Carolina General Statutes. The lease proposed to generate \$6,000 annually from AT&T with a term of ten (10) years.

Due to unforeseen issues, AT&T was unable to pursue the tower commitment at that time and the project did not proceed further. However, AT&T has recommitted to constructing the tower at Rocky Knob Park.

Commissioner Deal, seconded by Commissioner Futrelle, moved to approve Communication Facility Easement Agreement and Utility Easement contingent upon the Tourism Development Authority's approval and the County Attorney's review.

VOTE: Aye-4(Miller, Blust, Deal, Futrelle) Nay-0 Absent-(Gable)

## D. Discussion of November Meeting Schedule

County Manager Geouque stated that the Election Day was on November 6, 2012, the same date of the next regular Board meeting. Since the Commissioners' Board Room is an official Polling place, the Board of Elections require the use of the Board Room that entire day. Historically, November has been a month with very few agenda items and, therefore, the County Manager recommended canceling the November 6, 2012, regular meeting due to the Board of Elections requiring use of the Board room. One meeting would be adequate to address County business; however, the date of that meeting could be changed from the scheduled date of November 20, 2012, if needed.

Commissioner Blust, seconded by Commissioner Deal, moved to cancel the Tuesday, November 6, 2012, regular Board meeting and to reschedule the Tuesday, November 20, 2012, Board meeting to Tuesday, November 13, 2012, at 5:30 P.M.

## E. Proposed Dates for the County Christmas Luncheon

County Manager Geouque proposed the dates of either Thursday, December 6, 2012, or Tuesday, December 11, 2012, for the Annual County Employees Christmas Luncheon which will be held at Dan'l Boone Inn from 12:00 P.M. to 2:00 P.M. The County Manager invited the County Attorney to attend as well.

By consensus, the Board agreed to hold the Annual County Employees Christmas Luncheon on December 11, 2012.

#### F. Boards and Commissions

County Manager Geouque stated that a term on the Watauga County Board of Adjustment was set to expire in November. Ms. Janet Miller, who currently holds that seat, is available for reappointment to the 3 year term. At the October 2, 2012, Board meeting, a volunteer application was submitted from Mr. Adam Rhyne who was also interested in serving on this Board. The soon-to-be vacant seat is for an at-large member. Two of the six seats on the Board are filled with at-large members. The other 4 are filled by representatives of the zoned and watershed areas in the County.

Commissioner Blust, seconded by Chairman Miller, moved to appoint Mr. Adam Rhyne to the Watauga County Board of Adjustments as an At-Large member.


The location of the memorial is in the Town of Boone's ETJ and issues that will need to be considered are:

- 1. Landscaping plan what is required by the Town and allowed around building, or NOT due to security.
- 2. Town of Boone's UDO regulations.
- 3. BREMCO power line easement.
- 4. Possible DOT ROW encroachment agreement to grade in ROW.

Staff is of the opinion that an architect would be needed to design, facilitate, and provide construction management and documents for the project. North Carolina G.S. 143-64.32 requires the use of the Qualifications-Based Selection (QBS) process for procurement of professional services performed by architects, engineers, surveyors, and construction managers at risk unless the Board exempts itself.

Staff would recommend the Board hire Mr. Bill Dixon based on his understanding of the project scope and concept. Should the Board wish to hire Mr. Dixon, the Board would be required to exempt the project from the Qualifications-Based Selection (QBS) process. A negotiated contract with Appalachian Architecture will be forthcoming for Board approval and County Attorney review, if directed to proceed.

# PROGRAM EVALUATION NCDHSR LICENSURE REQUIREMENTS

As required by the NC Division of Health Service Regulation (formerly Division of Facility Services), the Project on Aging Director must conduct an annual comprehensive evaluation of agency operations and policies. The evaluation shall assure the appropriateness and quality of the agency's services with findings used to verify policy implementation, to identify problems, and to establish problem resolution and policy revision as necessary.

An overall policy and administration review was conducted on the following areas: scope of services offered, arrangements for services with other agencies or individuals, admission and discharge policies, supervision and plan of care, emergency care, service records, personnel qualifications, and program evaluation. The attached annual report addresses statistical information regarding: number of clients receiving each service; number of visits or hours for each service; client outcomes; adequacy of staff to meet client needs; numbers and reasons for non-acceptance of clients; and reasons for discharge.

The agency continues to make and receive referrals to/from allied health agencies as necessary. All agency relationships are satisfactory and ongoing. Ongoing staffings with appropriate home health agencies regarding CAP clients are conducted to discuss mutual clients. The Project on Aging also participates in the Watauga County Elderly and Disabled Adult Abuse Prevention Team, the Adult Services Coalition, the Watauga County Caregiver Council, the Watauga/Avery Caregiver Foundation, and the Watauga County and High Country Falls Prevention Coalitions.

# **CLIENT DEMOGRAPHICS**

During FY 2012, more females than males were served through the In-Home Services programs; 75% of the clients were female, and 25% of the clients were male. Fourty-eight percent (48%) of the In-Home Services clients served were classified as economically needy while 99.4% of in-home clients were classified as at-risk or high-risk for being placed in a facility or not being able to remain in their own homes. The majority of the clients served were over the age of 75 (70%) while 91% were over the age of 60.

Currently, by census projection, there are 8,000+ residents in Watauga County over the age of 60. The Lois E. Harrill Senior Center continues to grow with many activities being requested especially in the areas of wellness/fitness and computers with some classes/activities requiring a waiting list. The Lois E. Harrill Senior Center received more than \$4,000 in donated items during FY 2012. The State of NC is requiring more evidence based health promotion programs and is tying reimbursement to these programs. During FY 2012, we offered Arthritis Exercise, Living Healthy, and Fit & Strong, which are three evidence based health promotion classes.

According to the numbers listed above, over 5,000 individuals utilized the Western Watauga Community Center during FY 2012. The Western Watauga Community Center will need to be expanded in order to meet the needs of the older adults in that area. It is not possible to schedule multiple classes, meetings, etc., due to limited space. We were able to expand into the unused WAMY space, which provided a room for exercise equipment, and space to conduct exercise classes and small group meetings/classes. The parking lot at the WWCC is also heavily used with almost 4,000 additional vehicles using the parking lot for events such as the Watauga County TDY Playhouse Festival; Blood, Sweat, and Gears; CCP&D Music Fest; and the CCP&D Heritage Day.

#### NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The Project on Aging's revenues were more than projected during FY 2012, and expenditures were less than projected as well. We also maintained a Medicaid Revenue collection rate of 99.6%!

Services were delivered above the prior year's level in Home Delivered Meals; 27,650 (+1,081) Home Delivered Meals were delivered to 174 frail adults (-18). Meals were not delivered four (4) days during FY 2012 due to severe weather. Emergency meals were provided to cover those days.

Services were delivered below the prior year's level for In-Home Aide Services; 14,927 hours (-976) of In-Home Aide Services were delivered to 204 frail adults (+7). The number of In-Home Aide hours delivered through the CAP program was up by 117, and the number of aide hours delivered through the HCCBG, DSS, and County funded services was down by 1,093. The decline in the number of hours provided through the In-Home Aide (Levels I & II), Family Caregiver Respite, and DSS services can be attributed to two In-Home Aides being out on extended sick leave.

The Agency has approved clients on waiting lists for Home Delivered Meals and In-Home Aide. During FY 2012, the Home Delivered Meals program averaged 123 clients at any given time with an average of 6 on the waiting list. The In-Home Aide program averaged 136 clients and 28 on the waiting list, with more than 23 current clients who are eligible for and need additional service. The CAP program maintained an average caseload of 38 clients with no waiting list during FY 2012.

The Project on Aging's goal continues to be to provide services to the over 60 and disabled adult population, thereby allowing them to maintain their independence as opposed to premature institutionalization. Services to the frail elderly may decrease in FY 2013 due to budget constraints. However, the Project on Aging will continue to focus on providing services to the frailest, oldest, and poorest residents. As the at-home population becomes older and frailer with more acute needs for services, the demand for services will need to be addressed.


